Teens Spend 8 Hours At TV In Week

Cincinnati—(NC)—A survey of the television habits of 480 seniors in four local Catholic high schools has indicated that these teenagers watch TV for an average of about eight hours a week.

Asked if watching television had a tendency to interfere with studying and doing your homework, 245 said "yes" and 235 answered "no." In the survey, conducted by Father Joseph Herz, S.M., of Purcell High School.

The questionnaire, designed to gather facts for a televised discussion by students, was distributed to seniors in Purcell (boys), Regina and St. Mary's High Schools, and St. Ursula's Academy (all girls).

The 244 girls who replied said they spent an average of four and a third hours watching TV from Monday to Friday and another four hours over the weekend. The 216 boys answering listed an average of a little more than three and a half hours for the school week and close to four hours for the weekend.
