Cardinal Mooney Marks Tenth Anniversary

Tenth anniversary of the announcement from the Vatican that Archbishop Edward Mooney of Detroit had been elevated to membership in the Sacred College of Cardinals was noted in "The Michigan Catholic," archdiocesan newspaper, last week.

Cardinal Mooney who prior to Aug. 1, 1937 had been fourth Bishop of Rochester, was named a Cardinal on Dec. 23, 1945 and the public consistory at which Pope Pius XII conferred the red hat took place Feb. 21, 1946.

The Cardinal-elect was accompanied to the consistory by the present Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey of Rochester, who had served as Cardinal Mooney's secretary when Bishop of Rochester.

ACHIEVEMENTS OF Cardinal Mooney as leader of the Detroit archdiocese are recorded at length in the Detroit Catholic newspaper.

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Expanded Program Of Public Health Education Listed By Health Association

An expanded program in public health education and services dealing with the various areas of health covered by the Association, is planned during the coming year by the Health Association of Rochester and Monroe County.

In addition to carrying out an effective rehabilitation program for persons in this community who are recovering or have recovered from TB, the Health Association, during 1956, will cooperate with Iola Sanatorium, state and local health departments and the Monroe County Cancer Society in a mass chest X-ray survey to detect not only TB, but also lung cancer, heart disease and other chest conditions.

Rehabilitation of heart and arthritic patients also will be expanded by the Association. A special class for homemakers with cardiac and arthritic limitations will begin at the Association Headquarters, 973 East Avenue, on January 11th. The purpose of the class is to show homemakers how to conserve energy in routine housework.

In the County, these programs will be financed by the proceeds

of the 1955 Christmas Seal Sale.

To date, \$35,320.00 or 80% of the quota of \$44,000.00 has been reached.

realized in other activities to build the school. Cost of the school is estimated at \$35,000.

The parish marked its 25th anniversary at a Solemn High Mass on March 8, 1955.

Priests of the Congregation of the Most Precious Blood have had charge of the parish since its foundation.

Father Sebastian was present at the church's dedication, March 2, 1950 and served as assistant until 1957 when he was named pastor.

The school was planned and built under his direction.
