## Pontiff Approves New Painless Childbirth Method

"It is a question here," he said, "of natural painless childbirth in which no artificial means are used, but the mother's natural forces alone are called into play." The Pontiff noted that the new method—already in being since 1934—was used only in Russia and Communist China but in Western countries, including France, where it is practiced in two Catholic institutions—at Jallieu and Cambrai.

However, he added this note of caution: "When faced with scientific discovery of painless childbirth, the Christian is careful not to believe it unreservedly and not to use it with unqualified haste. A Christian mother, the Pope said, "knows that suffering can be a source of good, if she bears it with God and in obedience to His will."  
Explaining the new method, Pope Pius said it involves giving the mother, long before childbirth, intensive instruction concerning the processes of pregnancy and birth. A repeated appeal, he said, is made to the mother's will and emotions to control the nervous reactions set up by the muscular movements of labor. During labor the mother is not left to her own resources, but is assisted by specially trained personnel who reassure her of what she has learned.

"These measures are beneficial for the mother and fully conform to the will of the Creator," the Pope said, adding: "Viewed and understood in this way, the method is a natural elevating influence, protecting the mother from superficiality and levity, it induces her personality in a positive manner, so that at the very moment of childbirth she may manifest the firmness and solidarity of her character."  
Under other aspects, too, the method can lead to positive moral achievements. If pain and fear are successfully eliminated from childbirth, that very fact stimulates any inclination to commit marital acts in the use of marriage rights.

## LeMoyné Receives \$100,000 Grant, Plan New Jesuit Faculty House

Syracuse — A grant of \$100,000, gift of the Rosamond Gifford Charitable Corp., was received last week by LeMoyné College here. The gift will enable LeMoyné to break ground this spring for a new Jesuit faculty house.  
After the gift was announced, college officials said it will make possible the construction of a \$750,000 home for Jesuit instructors.

Mrs. Gifford once owned the 103-acre Salt Springs tract where the college campus is now located. She sold the land to LeMoyné on April 14, 1945, and still owns land adjacent to the campus.  
Leonard F. Markert, chairman of the Board of Regents at LeMoyné, said the Gifford grant provided the "impetus" which has enabled the college to procure other "sizeable gifts for the project."  
He explained that members of the Board of Regents at LeMoyné and their families are donating "services" to the college. Other donations for the building have come from "friends in local industry, finance and commerce."  
The Very Rev. Robert E. Green, S. J., LeMoyné's president, said the new faculty structure will provide permanent housing for between 45 and 50 Jesuit Fathers who will teach at the college.  
In addition to the individual living quarters, the building will house a central dining room, guest dining room, kitchen facilities, shower rooms, study space, guest rooms, central lounge and library facilities. The building will contain about 450,000 cubic feet of space.  
At present, the Jesuit fathers are living off-campus in temporary quarters. It was said that these quarters at 953 James St. will be sold and receipts from the sale will be applied to the construction fund.

The new building will be located east of the administration and science buildings.  
Mrs. William Holbrook, trustee and assistant secretary of the Gifford Charitable Fund, issued this statement: "The GIFFORD Foundation is pleased to participate in the financing of this top priority need of LeMoyné College. In order to grow and better serve the students who attend this educational institution it is necessary to first provide permanent and satisfactory housing for its faculty personnel."  
While the recent grant from the Ford Foundation to LeMoyné College means another need of providing increase in salaries to teaching personnel, it left LeMoyné College with its number one problem still unsolved, continued Mrs. Holbrook. "The Gifford trustees approved this grant as that the major stumbling blocks to the increasing importance and growth of this institution in Central New York can be finally removed."  
The Trustees of the Gifford Foundation feel that Syracuse and Onondaga County should be adequately prepared to meet the increasing demand for higher educational facilities which will arise within the next few years. This grant to LeMoyné College will better equip this institution to meet this problem.
