### Emmett Neary Named 'Outstanding Fighter'

Emmett Neary was named winner of the Ray Hickok trophy as the outstanding fighter of the Mission Bouts at the annual bouts presented by Aquinas last Saturday at the Community War Memorial.

Dayton, O.—(NC)—Catholic women should bring "womanly qualities" into politics, business and the professions, Father John F. Murphy, C.S.B., president of St. John Fisher College, Rochester, N. Y., said here.

Addressing the Dayton Chapter International Federation of Catholic Alumnae, at a luncheon meeting, Father Murphy declared that woman's essential mission in the world is to be a "living example" of total dedication to God and His children.

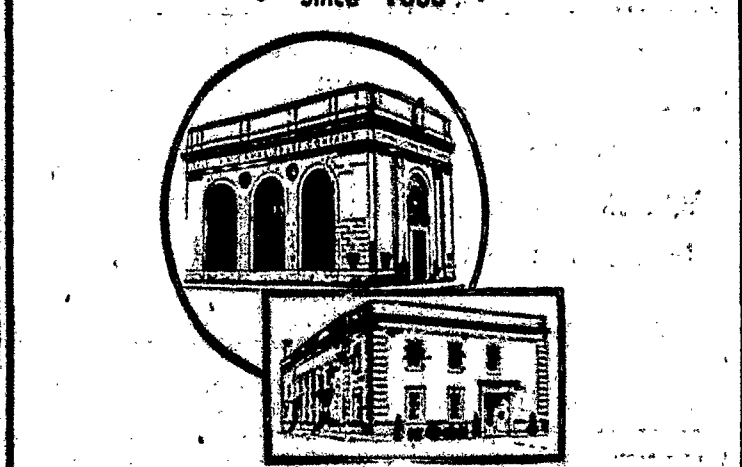
