

\$175,000-Goal For Improvements Sought By Corpus Christi Parish

A fund campaign for \$175,000 toward complete renovation of Corpus Christi parish properties in Rochester was announced this week by the Very Rev. John E. Maney, parish administrator.

Plans include repair and improvement, both inside and out, of the church, school, rectory and convent, as well as provision for a new parking area.

ALL PARISH buildings are located on property at the corner of Main St. E. and Prince St. with the exception of the convent, which is at 24 Prince St. adjacent to the grounds of the Academy of the Sacred Heart. Sisters of St. Joseph staff Corpus Christi School.

Frederick Young heads the committee for the fund drive, with Hugh Cooke, Robert Cortis, David Gordon, John J. Kost, and Irving Smith as co-chairmen. A large general committee is now being organized.

Titled the Corpus Christi parish Financial Need Appeal, the campaign solicitation is scheduled for a two-hour period on Sunday afternoon, Mar. 25, when parishioners will be asked to remain at home until contacted by a worker. Assisting in directing the campaign is Foley Associates Inc., a Rochester fund-raising organization.

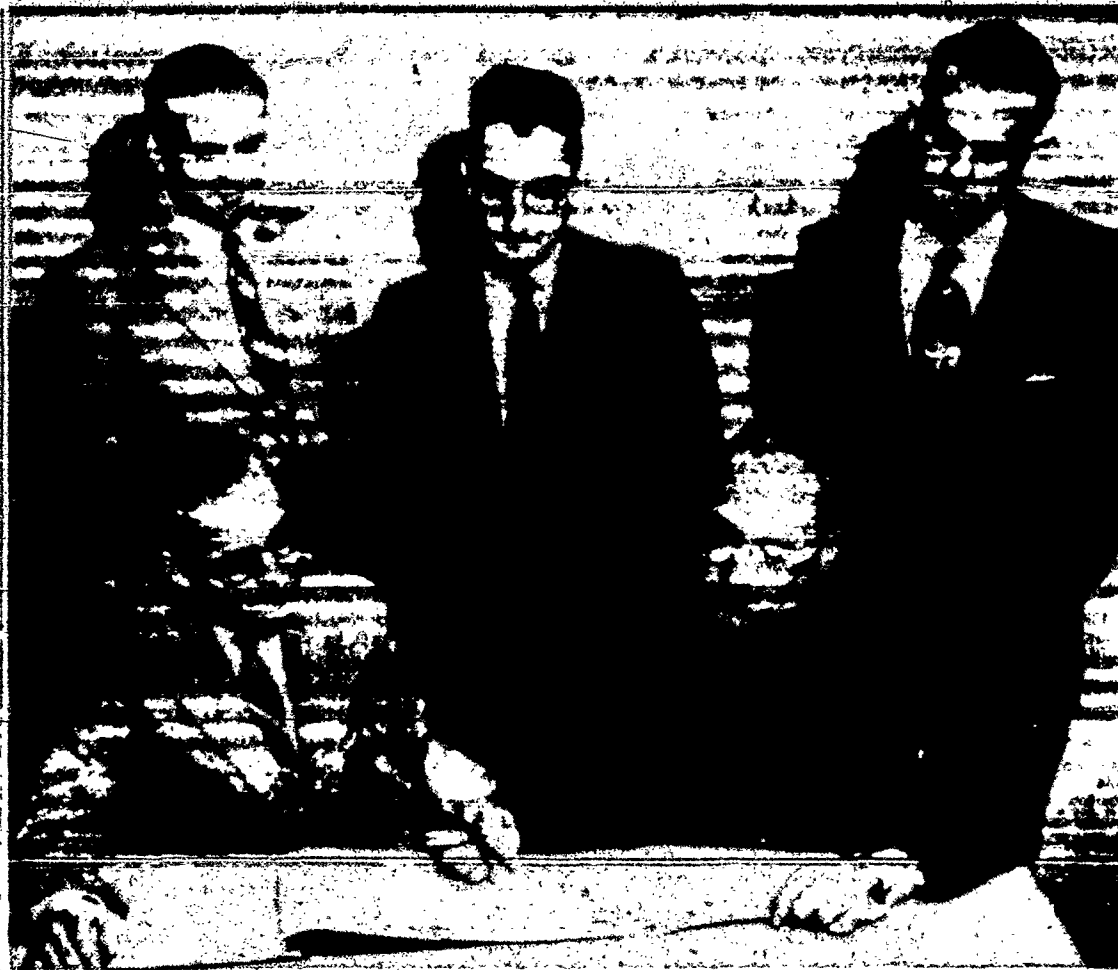

Church, School Fund Drive Planned For New Christ The King Parish

Funds for the erection of church and school buildings for the newly-established parish of Christ the King in Irondequoit will be sought in a parishwide campaign next month, the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Charles J. Mahoney, pastor, announced this week.

A minimum goal of \$125,000 in three-year pledges will be the objective of the solicitation, scheduled during a two-hour period on Sunday afternoon, March 25. Formation of a large campaign committee is underway, Monsignor Mahoney said.

THE PROPOSED church and school buildings, planned for completion next September, will be constructed on the west side of N. Goodman St. south of Titus Ave. and on the northern end of a 70-acre tract. The church, to accommodate 800 persons, is being designed for future conversion to a parish auditorium.

Temporary campaign headquarters have been established in the basement of a bank building at the corner of Titus Avenue and Cooper Road. Assisting in the direction of the drive, titled the Parish of Christ the King Fund Appeal, is Foley Associates Inc., a Rochester fund-raising organization.
