Buffalo Paper Suspends 'Orphan Annie'

Editors Find Dick Tracy Too 'Bloody'

More than one large daily newspaper has decided that current episodes of two highly popular comic strips aren't quite so funny as they once were. The editors of three Western newspapers demanded and got a review of Chester Gould's Dick Tracy strip on the ground that the death of Tracy's current enemy, Joe Fero, was too bloody. First to protest was the editor of the Mormon-owned Deseret News in Salt Lake City. The Portland Oregonian and the Denver Post followed suit. The result: The Chicago Tribune — New York News Syndicate, which distributes the strip, has offered a less graphic version to its 400 p a p e r subscribers. Editors may take their pick. Another comic strip to raise the ire of at least one editor is Little Orphan Annie. The Courier-Express of Buffalo, N. Y., has temporarily dropped it because, said the editor, "the creators of the picture strip have placed Annie in an atmosphere of hoodlumism and violence." The article concerning the absence of the strip explained that the current episode flouts by inference the forces of law and order and glorifies the "mob" and the "syndicate." Annie will return to the paper's comic page when she starts a new, and less objectionable adventure, the article said. Last month, Mgr. George G. Higgins, director, Social Action Department, National Catholic Welfare Conference, took the Little Orphan Annie comic strip to task for "degenerating into a political tract with a demonstrably anti-union bias."

Charity Nuns To Quit Care Of Syracuse Hospital

Syracuse, N. Y. —(NC)—Transfer of administration of St. Mary's Hospital and Infant Home here on March 1 from the Daughters of Charity to the Sisters of the Little Company of Mary is announced by Bishop Walter A. Foery of Syracuse. Sister Isabel, provincial superior of the Daughters of Charity, Emmitsburg, notified Bishop Foery that lack of sufficient interested nurses and hospital administrators in the order made operation difficult. The Little Company of Mary is a nursing order which has its American motherhouse at San Pierre, more important as a maternity hospital in Evergreen Park, Ill.

'Courier' Circulation 'Full Coverage' Reported From 115 Parishes

A total of 115 of the 146 parishes in the Diocese of Rochester are currently listed as "total coverage" parishes in the Courier-Journal's campaign to have a Counter in every home of the Diocese. According to reports reaching the Courier-Journal's circulation office, parishes are reporting increased subscription totals over last year's record figures. This week, Rev. Alexander Hesse, pastor of St. John's Church, Newark Valley, and St. Francis Church, Catonak, announced that these parishes have adopted the "total coverage" plan for the first time, with 46 subscriptions. Rev. Jerome A. Holubowicz, O.F.M.Conv., pastor of St. Francis Church, Auburn, also has enrolled all families of that parish for the first time this year, reporting a total of 407 subscriptions there. Renewing the 100 per cent program adopted in previous years are the following parishes, as reported this week by Elmer Graepenstetter circulation manager of the Courier-Journal: St. Theodore, Rochester, Rev. Raymond J. Epping, pastor, 430 subscriptions; St. Januarius, Naples, and St. Matthias, Atlanta, Rev. Henry C. Blier, 60; St. Ann, Hornell, Rt. Rev. Mgr. Laurence W. Gannon, V.F., 66; St. Bernard, Scipio Center, 36; St. Hilary, Genoa, 43; and St. Isaac Jogues, Fleming, 20. Rev. Leo E. Hastings, pastor. Also continuing the "total coverage" plans are St. Patrick, Moravia, 163; and St. Ann, Owego, co. 48, Rev. Orrin W. Feller, pastor; St. Joseph, Weedsport, Rev. Leo A. Jones, 146; St. Bridget, Rochester, Rev. Gerald T. Brennan, 154; and St. Ann, Palmyra, Rev. William A. Doran, 107. Our Lady of the Lake, King Ferry, 60; and All Saints, Ludlowville, 41, Rev. Frederick L. Walz; Most Precious Blood, Rochester, Rev. Sebastian Contegiacomo, C.P.S., 170; Chapel of the Divine Compassion, Rev. John A. Murphy, chaplain, 51; St. Mary, Bath, Rev. Henry C. Manly, 239; and St. Mary, Canandaigua, Rev. Alphonsus Crimmins, 853. The Catholic Chapel at Bradford and St. Joseph's, Campbell, Rev. Stanislaus Blaszczyk, administrator, reports 62 subscriptions. Complete reports from all parishes will be published as soon as possible following the conclusion of the current February circulation campaign of the Courier-Journal.
