Rochesterian Named First Superior In Ireland

Reverend Mother Mary Helena O'Connell, the former Irene O'Connell of Rochester, was recently installed as first superior of St. Teresa of Silverstream Monastery, County Meath, Ireland.

The newly opened Monastery is the first foundation of the contemplative Order of the Visitation to be established in Ireland.

Reverend Mother Mary Helena is a daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Timothy J. O'Connell, former parishioners of Holy Redeemer Church.

She has one brother, John J. O'Connell, and two sisters, Mrs. Joseph G. White and Miss Helen O'Connell, all of this city. Another brother, Joseph T. O'Connell, is deceased.

REVEREND MOTHER received her education at St. Bridget School, Nazareth Academy, and Nazareth Conservatory of Music. She entered the Visitation Order at Toledo, Ohio.

Previous to going to Ireland, Reverend Mother was one of the original band sent to establish a monastery in Atlanta, Ga. in 1953.

The Irish Monastery of the Visitation is located 29 miles from Dublin and 4 miles from the town of Stamullen. The sisters are now in the process of renovation and building in order to have full Papal enclosure.

Noted Playwright Leo Brady Slated For College Lecture

Leo Brady, author, lecturer and playwright, will speak on "American Theatre and the Drama Today" in the Nazareth College Auditorium on Tuesday, Feb. 28 at 8 p.m.

Brady, who for the past ten years has taught Speech and Drama at The Catholic University of America, Washington, D. C., will appear as part of Nazareth College's Lecture Series program for 1955-56.

Now an associate Professor at Catholic University, he is the author of "Edge of Doom" which won the 1949 Golden Book Award in Fiction of the Catholic Writers' Guild of America. After its publication in 1949, Samuel Goldwyn of Hollywood paid Mr. Brady \$125,000 for movie rights to the novel.

BORN in Wheeling, W. Va., Brady moved with his family to Washington in 1931. He received his B.A. in English from Catholic University in 1941 and was awarded the M.A. in Speech and Drama in 1942.

After U.S. Army service in World War II, during which time he was a radio writer and producer for troop entertainment, he returned to Catholic University in 1946 to teach Speech and Drama under the Rev. Gilbert V. Hartke, O.P., head of the Speech and Drama Department there.

His first play, "Brother Orchid," was produced at the university in 1933. In 1940, his verse play, "Calidore" appeared. Brady also collaborated on three musical comedies at Catholic University with Walter F. Kerr, former associate professor there and now drama critic to the New York Herald Tribune.
