Schedule of Holy Week services at the Cathedral of the Sacred Heart was announced today by His Excellency, Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey, rector.

**HOLY THURSDAY**—Solemn Pontifical Mass of the Blessing of the Holy Oils will be celebrated by His Excellency, Bishop James E. Kearney at 9 a.m. A Low Mass will be celebrated at 5:30 p.m. and Bishop Casey will celebrate the Solemn Pontifical Mass of the Last Supper at 7:45 p.m. Holy Communion will be given at the 5:30 and 7:45 p.m. Masses only.

**GOOD FRIDAY**—The Three Hours Service, including sermons on the Seven Last Words of Christ by Rev. Daniel Hunt, C.P., will be conducted from 1

until 3 p.m. At 3 p.m. Bishop Kearney will celebrate the Solemn Liturgy commemorating the Passion and Death of our Lord. Holy Communion will be given at this 3 p.m. service.

**HOLY SATURDAY**—The Solemn Easter Vigil will begin at 11 p.m. and will include the blessing of the new fire, paschal candle, baptismal water, renewal of baptismal vows, and litany. At midnight, Solemn Pontifical Mass will be celebrated by Bishop Casey. St. Bernard's Seminary Choir will sing at the solemn ceremonies of Holy Week in the Cathedral. The students of St. Bernard's will attend these functions and have charge of the ceremonies.

There will be no Pontifical Mass on Easter morning.

Bids were awarded and ground broken for the new Our Lady of Lourdes School in West Elmira, this week. The Rev. Leo G. Schwab, pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes Church announced that revised plans for the new school were approved by His Excellency Bishop Kearney and construction would start immediately.

McLane Construction Co. of Elmira were the successful bidder for the general contract. Other contracts were awarded to Hogg Nichols Inc. for heating, ventilating and plumbing and G. H. and J. T. Kelly, for electrical work.

TOTAL of the general contract is \$271,131 and additional items including site improvement, road extensions sewer connections, utilities and equipment will bring the total cost to \$306,200.

Three classrooms of the new school located at W. First St. and Demarest Parkway are expected to be ready for occupancy in September. The school will be staffed by the Sisters of Mercy.
