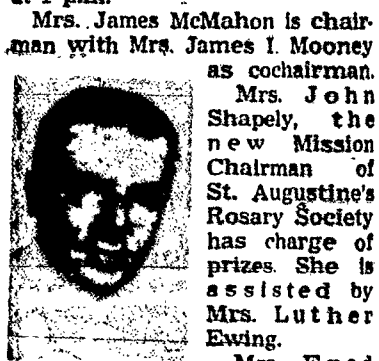


### Dessert Card Party To Aid Jesuit Missioner In India

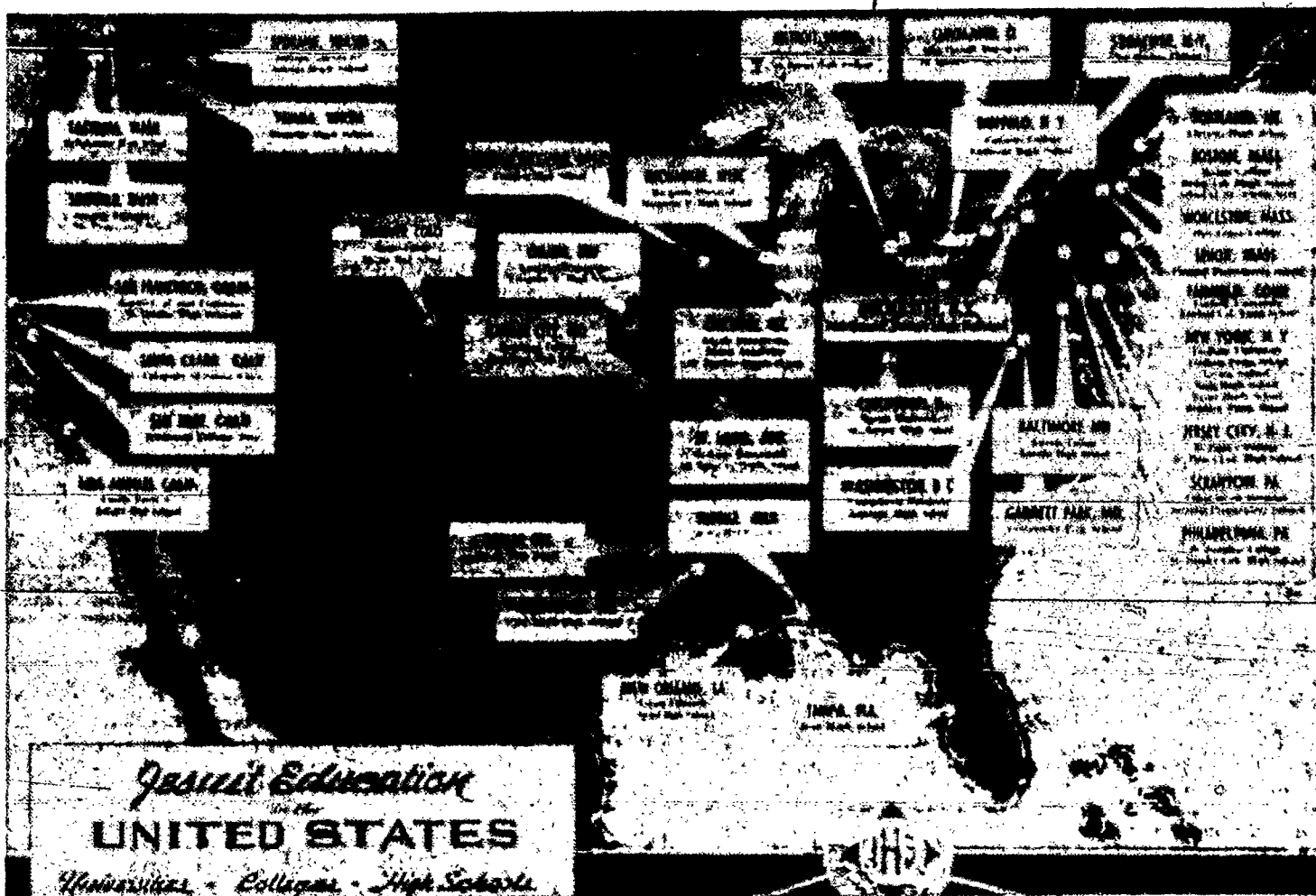

### KC Council Presents Check To Bp. Kearney

A surprise presentation of a check for \$500 to His Excellency Bishop Kearney for the Bishop's program featured the annual Communion breakfast of Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus in Columbus Civic Center, Sunday morning.

Presentation was made by Grand Knight Donald E. Woerner during the speaking program. The Bishop in acknowledging the gift said that these gifts of the Knights of Columbus have been useful in the education program of the diocese.

THE KNIGHTS and their sons assisted at Mass and received Holy Communion in St. Joseph Church. Bishop Kearney celebrated the Mass with the Rev. Francis X. Kenney, C.S.S.R., assisting. The K. of C. choir sang the Mass. The Fourth Degree Knights furnished an escort to the Bishop led by the Streb-Lappan-Klem Post color guard.

At the close of the Mass the Bishop told the knights that frequent Communion "is part and parcel of your lives. To preserve the ideals of knighthood you must remain close to Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament."

His Excellency cited the program of the K. of C. for education, welfare, Catholic activity and charitable enterprises and particularly stressed the Apostleship of the Press as carried on in the current advertising program. This great movement, the Bishop said, is possible only through the united effort of each knight and each council of the order.

Asking the knights to remember Pope Pius XII on the Pope's 80th birthday, Bishop Kearney said that no other Pope has so commended the work of the Knights as the present Pontiff. Pope Pius XII is "a great Knight of God," the Bishop said, "has great responsibilities on his shoulders and has no concept of such a thing as selfishness."

Principal speaker at the breakfast was Genesee County Judge Philip Weiss of Batavia. Judge Weiss expounded the theme "Parenthood is the most important profession in the world." He recited the preparations necessary for the Priesthood, for medicine and other professions and contrasted the training for parenthood, almost none, he said, in many instances.

Parenthood, the speaker said, is the noblest natural vocation that can be given to man and woman. He said that wise parents encourage frequent Communion among their children which is an essential for future parenthood and said expectant mothers will do well to take the Blessed Mother for her example. Emmett J. Schnepp presided as toastmaster and the program was opened by Chairman Thomas J. Meagher, former Children's Court Judge, John J. Curran was ticket chairman.
