Speaker Urges Laity Holy Week Participation

Canandaigua — Participation of the laity in Holy Week services was stressed by the Rev. Benedict Ehmman, pastor of St. Mary at the Lake Church, Watkins Glen, addressing the First Saturday Luncheon here March 3. "As Holy Week goes, so goes the year," Father Ehmman said speaking in a Canandaigua hotel. He urged his hearers to avail themselves of the opportunities presented for more fully participating of the graces presented in the new regulations for Holy Week promulgated by Pope Pius XII.

DISCUSSING the New Liturgy of Holy Week, Father Ehmman explained the changes particularly the regulations for Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil of Holy Saturday. The speaker was presented by the Rev. Kenneth Holloren of Newark, moderator of the Ontario-Besseca-Yates deanery of the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women sponsoring the luncheon. About 150 women attended. Guests introduced by Mrs. William Noonan of Newark, president, were: the Rev. Alphonsus R. Crimmins, pastor of St. Mary Church, Canandaigua and assistant, the Rev. We therefore let each one do what he can do with the help of his prayers and the help of his brethren and the help of his community. . . ."
