### Niagara Lists Noted Counterspy

Niagara University, N. Y. — Herbert Philbrick, citizen, "communist," and counterspy, who postponed his own life to help reveal the great Communist conspiracy in the United States, will deliver the final lecture in a series of four, sponsored by the Niagara University student council, Tuesday, March 13, at 8 p.m. in the university student center.

Philbrick, who is featured on the television series, "I Led 3 Lives," will speak on "Communism in Government."

His decision to go underground as a Communist, while working as an FBI counterspy, was difficult for the young advertising executive who was on the threshold of a fine career.

While working in his triple role, Philbrick's burden was heavy. In addition to carrying on his own business, he spent long hours at Communist cell meetings, planning, writing pamphlets and listening to endless indoctrination lectures. At home, he spent endless hours hidden in an attic room, writing details to the FBI.

After relinquishing his roles as Communist and counterspy and following his testimony in the trials of the 11 top Reds in 1949, it was some months before he and his family could settle down to a new life. Noles and threats of retaliation poured in upon him for several months and his entire family was under FBI protection.

Although he has rendered his country one of its greatest services, Philbrick continues to give of his time and energy to the fight against Communism. He considers his lectures one of the greatest means through which he may warn Americans on how to recognize the Communists and detect their infiltration into innocent groups.

### Auburnite Receives Habit In Poor Clare Monastery

Miss Joan Kelley, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Eugene Kelley of St. Alphonsus Church, Auburn, will receive the habit of a Poor Clare nun on Monday, March 19 in the Monastery of the Poor Clares, Bronx, N. Y.

The Very Rev. Benedict Joseph Dudley, O.F.M., Definitor of Holy Name Province, has been delegated by His Eminence Cardinal Spellman to officiate at the ceremony, which will begin with Holy Mass.

Father Dudley will be assisted by the Franciscan Fathers. Miss Kelley attended Holy Family High School, Auburn and is a graduate of Nazareth College, Rochester.

THE POOR CLARES are the Second Order of St. Francis, founded in Assisi in 1212. The Nuns are strictly cloistered; they follow the Primitive Rule of Saint Clare and renounce solemn vows of poverty, chastity, obedience and enclosure.

Their life is one of prayer, silence, mortification, and extreme simplicity. Holy Mass, Exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament, chanting of the Divine Office during the day and at midnight, mental prayer and other prayer in common occur about seven and one-half hours of the day. The other waking hours are spent in sewing, which includes the making of altar linens and vestments, the manual labor required for the care of the monastery, a daily period of recreation, and spiritual reading.

ASSISTING THE Nuns to lead their cloistered life are the Extern Sisters, who take part in most of the activities within the enclosure and, in addition, attend to the external affairs of the monastery.

The Order of Saint Clare was established in the United States in 1875 by Venerable Mother Mary Magdalene and her sister, Mother Mary Constance, who came from the Monastery of St. Lawrence in Panispina, Italy and built the first monastery in Omaha, Nebraska.

New York foundation was begun in 1915 by the late Mother Mary Seraphim Lynch, at the invitation of His Eminence Cardinal Farley.
