Alhambra Opens Baltimore Building As Headquarters

Baltimore — (NC) — The internal headquarters office of the Order of the Alhambra, Catholic fraternal organization, was dedicated here in Baltimore.

It was a case of an organization devoted to erecting monuments and markers commemorating important events, places and personages in Catholic history on the North American continent, setting up its central base of operations in "the Monumental City" as Baltimore has been called.

The building was blessed and dedicated by the Rev. James V. Ennis of North Evans, supreme chaplain, who was assisted by the Rev. John A. Tribull, C.S.S.R., chaplain of the Baltimore unit of the organization, Alcala Caravan.

HARRY J. BROGAN of Buffalo, supreme commander, in a brief dedication address, said that last year the organization celebrated its golden anniversary. He added "As you know, growth and progress has been slow, very slow in fact, when compared to the rapid construction of this new building. However, our future is bright and our spirit and morale high."

The headquarters building is designed in Spanish influence. The Alhambra now has Caravans in most major cities of the United States and Canada and presently is engaged in organization in Mexico. Although the organization has no official connection with the Knights of Columbus, each of its members must be a third degree K. of C.

Musa Caravan, No. 25 is the unit of the order in Rochester.

Code Chief Denies Seal To C-Film

New York — (NC) — The three-part French film, "Letters from My Windmill," has been denied the seal of approval of Hollywood's Motion Picture Production Code.

The film, which earlier was condemned by the Legion of Decency, violates the Code's requirement that "ceremonies of any definite religion should be carefully and respectfully handled." Geoffrey Shurlock, director of the Code Office, said in a letter to Tohan Pictures here, distributors of the film.

MR. SHURLOCK SAID the first episode of the movie, which deals with the gluttony of a medieval priest at Christmas, violates the provision that "ministers of religion in their character as ministers should not be used as comic characters or villains."

The Legion's rating of "Class C," or condemned, was given because the film "contains in the first two episodes a frivolous, disrespectful and grossly comical presentation of religion and religious characters."

"Its exhibition in entertainment motion picture theatres is seriously objectionable and conducive to a misunderstanding of religious practices," the Legion added.

Catholics Opened 19 Hospitals In Year

St. Louis, Mo. — (RNS) — Fourteen new Catholic hospitals were opened in the United States and five in Canada during 1955, bringing to 1502 the total number of such institutions in the two countries.

The figures were reported in the 27th annual directory issue of Hospital Progress, Journal of the Catholic Hospital Association of the U. S. and Canada published here.

Hospitals opened in the U. S. include those at Batavia and Gabriels in New York State; Brownville and Onamia in Minnesota; Milwaukee, Wis.; Little Rock, Ark.; Fullerton, Calif.; Fort Lauderdale, Fla.; Santa Rosa, N. M.; and Erie, Pa. Three of the new Canadian hospitals are in the Province of Ontario and two in Quebec Province.

The 19 new Catholic institutions have a total of 1,790 beds.
