



Brooklyn, N. Y. - (NC) -Rep. Victor L. Anfuso of New York has called on all Amer-icans of Italian descent to help in the struggle to keep linky free.

The coming municipal elections in Italy next May and the parliamentary elections there next fall will be a "life and death at regio" for the Italian people, the Congress-man told a gathering of the Italian American Professional and Businessmen's Association here.

He said that in these elections the people of Italy will have to decide "whether to stay with the free rations or cost i he i r lot with com-manian."
