Bp. Kearney To Keynote Corpus Christi Campaign

His Excellency Bishop James E. Kearney will keynote the Corpus Christi renovation fund drive when he addresses more than 400 men at a campaign kickoff dinner at 6:30 p. m. Saturday, March 24 in the church hall.

A two-hour parishwide solicitation is scheduled from 1:30 to 3:30 p. m. Sunday, March 25. Campaigners will attend Benediction in the church at 1:30 and then will make calls on parish members. Reports will be made immediately thereafter at campaign headquarters in the school.

A GOAL OF \$175,000 in three-year pledges is being sought toward costs of repair to all parish properties, including the church, school, rectory and convent, as well as for installation of a parking area.

The Rt. Rev. Msgr. John E. Maney, administrator, previously announced that the parish will purchase the St. Agnes Convent School building from the Sisters of St. Joseph and will raze the four-story structure late in summer. A completely paved parking area will be installed on the site, located between the church and school on East Main St. Parish priests will reside in the building during the summer months while the Prince Street rectory is being renovated.

The St. Agnes building which has served since 1888 as a convent, a Home of Industry for girls, a high school and a grammar school, has been declared no longer suitable for school purposes, and the present grammar school will be discontinued in June. It has 68 elementary and 40 music pupils. Besides the five Sisters on the staff, two Sister music instructors are in residence.

The Sisters of St. Joseph who staff Corpus Christi School reside in the parish convent at 24 Prince St., adjoining the grounds of the Academy of the Sacred Heart. The parish school has nearly 600 enrollees.

DEDICATION OF the first Corpus Christi building, a combination church-school structure which now is the central portion of the school building, occurred Nov. 4, 1888. The present church edifice was dedicated Sept. 21, 1902, by Bishop Bernard J. McQuaid, first Bishop of Rochester. At that time the church-school building to the east was renovated for all-school purposes; a front portion was added in 1913 and a rear in 1924, bringing the building to its present 16-room capacity.

Four pastors have served the parish. They include the Rev. James J. Leary (1888-1901); the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Dennis J. Curran, V.G. (1901-22); the Rt. Rev. John F. O'Hern, V.G. (1922-29), who became third Bishop of Rochester in 1929; and the Rt. Rev. Msgr. William M. Hart, F.A., V.G., who has been pastor since 1929.

Present assistant pastors are the Rev. William J. O'Brien, the Rev. Thomas F. McVeigh and the Rev. Lawrence E. Ward. The Rev. William M. Hart, Ph.D., is in residence.

Regulations for Good Friday call for fast and complete abstinence all day. Good Friday Liturgy will be held and Holy Communion may be received between 3 and 6 p. m. as scheduled by the individual pastor.

In order to receive Holy Communion on Good Friday, one must fast from alcoholic drink from the previous midnight, from solid food for three hours before communion and one hour from liquids. Water of course, may be taken any time.
