Echo Choral Group Slates Annual Scholarship Concert

Preliminary arrangements for its 47th Annual Concert and Ball to be given at St. Stanislaus School Auditorium, 900 Norton Street, on Saturday, April 28, were formulated at a meeting of the Schola Cantorum of the Rochester Echo Singing Association this week.
