## Bishop Kearney Presides At Mrs. Courneen Rites

His Excellency Bishop Kearney was in the sanctuary and gave the final blessing at the funeral of Mrs. Catherine E. Courneen in St. Augustine Church Friday, March 14.

Celebrant of the Solemn High Requiem Mass was the Rev. Francis V. Courneen, S.J., member of Fordham University faculty, grandson of the deceased. Deacon and sub-deacon were the Rev. Walter Fleming and the Rev. Albert Ryan.

Also in the sanctuary with Bishop Kearney were the Rt. Rev. Msgr. John M. Duffy, pastor of St. Augustine's; the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Maynard Cornell of St. Andrew Seminary; the Rev. James Barnett, rector of McQuaid Jesuit High School.

MRS. COURNEEN died March 13, 1956. She suffered a stroke Jan. 20 at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Robert E. Dolan, 143 Farragut St., where she made her home for the past eight years. Before that she was a resident of Lyons for about 60 years.

She was born March 22, 1866, in the Town of Henrietta, one of nine children of Michael and Margaret Hartman. She was baptized, received her first Holy Communion, was confirmed and was married in St. Joseph Church in Rush. Her husband, James J. Courneen, died in Lyons in 1931.

In Lyons Mrs. Courneen was a devoted member of St. Michael Church and its societies, and for a number of years was a member of Collins-Cassavino American Legion Post Auxiliary. In Rochester she was a member of the Rosary Society of St. Augustine Church.

Besides the Jesuit grandson, she is survived by another grandson-priest, the Rev. James P. Courneen, a Maryknoll missionary currently stationed in Bolivia. The prelates are sons of Frank D. Courneen, retired New York Central division passenger agent, 34 Rugby St., Rochester.

Other survivors besides those mentioned above are two sons, William R. Courneen, newspaper correspondent of Lyons, and Martin B. Courneen of Hartford, Conn.; 10 grandchildren; nine great-grandchildren; one sister, Mrs. Mary Fishell of Rush; also numerous nephews and nieces. Bearers were Joseph Courneen, Robert Courneen, George Small, and Thomas O'Grady and Mrs. Benedict Spiegel.
