Easter Monday Dance To Open 16th Year Of Immaculate Dances

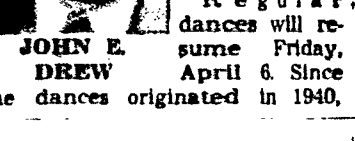
