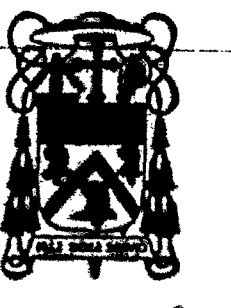

## Russian Bear Still Red

There is worldwide speculation, and worldwide confusion among communists themselves, over the recent debunking of Stalin by the Khrushchev regime in Moscow.

Three U.S. commentators have tried to explain what has happened behind the Kremlin's walls.

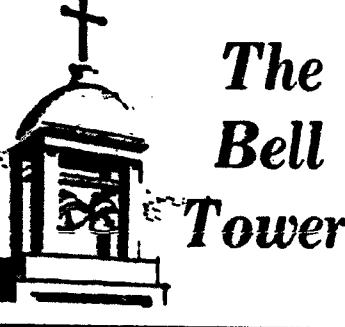
Nikolai E. Khokhlov in U.S. News and World Report states that "the revolution of the Russian people against the Soviet system has begun." He said that the Red leaders have "openly and publicly confirmed that dictatorship cannot exist any longer in the Soviet Union." He added that the Stalin blast was actually a confession admitting "the complete bankruptcy of the Soviet system."

Leon Volkov in Newsweek views the Stalin debunking as a "power fight inside the Kremlin" and that the people are helpless to do anything one way or another. Volkov believes that Communist Party leaders set out to cut Khrushchev "down to size" because they resented the personal popularity he won on his tour of Asia last year. Mikoyan decided to strike at Khrushchev by striking at Stalin. Khrushchev played it fast, joined the pack, and took over the lead, leaving Mikoyan with slim chances of becoming top man.

Louis E. Budenz, former managing editor of the Daily Worker, U.S. Communist newspaper, pointed out in his N.C.W.C. syndicated column that Khrushchev did not repudiate any of the fundamental principles held by Lenin or Stalin. Budenz said that "Khrushchev has consolidated his power and has taken Stalin's place as dictator." Budenz warned that the free world will make a "fatal mistake" unless it realizes that "nothing has changed except the persons of the

Recently, when four Hungarian workers fled through the Iron Curtain under machine gun fire to reach Austrian territory, they told Radio Free Europe reporters that the reason for their flight was "economic misery." It's a problem, one of them said, "when it takes more than a month to get a suit or a dress which usually looks terrible when finished."

Perhaps a more detailed case in point was described melodramatically by the Communist paper, Pravda, itself, which usually goes overboard to recolor any of the Red Regime deficiencies. Pravda pointed out the plight of a bride and groom who were unable to look like a happy twosome on their wedding day due to "retail and industrial failure." It seems that after Vasil and Klavdia planned to marry, the groom-to-be entered a tailor's shop in Moscow to try on his wedding suit. "The shock was so great," the story related, "that even the salesman was forced to admit: 'The suit looks unbelievably miserable. We will alter it. Come back in a month.'"

But my wedding is the week after next," the man pleaded. "He did not get his suit on time. The second blow struck the bride." Pravda wrote dramatically, "She went to the best and most luxurious dressmaker. Can I order a wedding dress in two weeks?"  
"Are you out of your mind?" they told her. "Don't you know there is a waiting list?"  
"The bride ran to a private dressmaker and was advised that new clients are accepted only by the recommendation of wives of prominent persons. In her need she ran to a second-grade dressmaker. Even so her dress was not ready for the wedding."

Is this funny? A Red soap opera? Not so funny to the 16 million living under the Kremlin-ruled regimes in Czechoslovakia, Poland, Hungary, Bulgaria, Romania — nor to the other millions in Russia.  
The fact is this: there is a sartorial caste system having little in common with Marxist principles flourishing today in the Soviet Union and its captive countries. The main reasons appear to be: a) lack of industrial know-how and equipment; b) lack of inspiration on the part of labor; c) the big Commie bosses come first; d) there is no equality under Communism.

## Lawyers Can't Cooperate In Sin

### Divorce Cases

Cincinnati — (NC) — Lawyers have no right to help validly married persons to get a divorce in order to remarry, an official of the Cincinnati archdiocese tribunal told a gathering of attorneys and judges here.

Msgr. Henry J. Vogelwohl told a meeting of the Natural Law Society sponsored by Xavier university: "It makes no difference whether the client is Catholic or not, because it is against the natural and the Divine positive law of God. And it makes no difference whether the lawyer is Catholic or not."

So far as Catholic clients are concerned, "no lawyer can cooperate in the sinful action of his client," the priest warned. "Therefore no Catholic lawyer may accept a client who seeks a divorce, if the person is a Catholic, until and unless that person has fulfilled the law of the Church by obtaining permission for civil action."

Msgr. Vogelwohl made it clear that a Catholic lawyer is not excused by the fact that a client can go elsewhere and get what he wants, or by the possible loss of a fee.

Moreover, "no Catholic lawyer may direct a client to another lawyer to procure what is wrong," Msgr. Vogelwohl added. "It is sinful for a Catholic lawyer to hand over a case for divorce to an associate in his office under the guise that the non-Catholic is not bound by the laws of the Church or of God. If he is not bound by God's laws he should not be an associate."

On the other hand, he went on, "if a non-Catholic client requests a divorce with no intention of remarrying, and the necessary and needed legal civil protection can be secured in no other way than by a divorce action, it would NOT be wrong for a Catholic lawyer to accept such a case. By accepting it, the attorney accepts the responsibility to learn from his client what his intentions are, and to determine in all honesty that

the desired civil effects are truly necessary and can be secured in no other way."

In this connection the speaker suggested to the lawyers that "a noble objective for Catholics, and indeed all members of the bar interested in better legislation, is to promote laws that will grant a separated and innocent spouse all the legal protection he or she needs — protection from physical violence, for support, for responsibility in debts, capacity to negotiate civil contracts, real estate purchases and sale — without the breaking of the marriage bond by a civil decree of divorce."

POINTING OUT THAT "a divorce decree is not the cure-all that some people are led to believe," Msgr. Vogelwohl declared: "It is the mark of a good lawyer to be helpful in doing all he can to encourage parties to a marriage to effect a reconciliation in a valid marriage and to point out the frequent futility of a divorce decree."

## JOSEPH BREIG Why the Stalin Debunking?

HERE WE GET into moral theology. It has always been Christian teaching that a good action is evil if done for an evil motive. If you give alms to a poor family because you have wicked designs on the daughter, your action is wicked. The communists have evil designs against God and man. That is the basic thing about communism — the thing that never changes, no matter how the party line twists and turns. This is the diabolism of communism: it warps souls so that people who ought to be attacking injustice for right reasons attack it for wrong reasons, and in evil ways. Thus evil is piled on evil. We know better than to suppose that the communists really have changed. Khrushchev & Co. are using the truth about Stalin merely as another means of deluding and disarming the world. WE MUST remember that the real communist accepts, as his philosophy of life, the idea that anything is good that advances communism, and everything is bad that doesn't. The communist sells his soul to the principle that in communism's service, it is good to lie, cheat, spy, steal, corrupt others, torture, blaspheme and murder. It is good even to tell the truth for the purpose of deceiving people — to turn truth to the service of falsehood. This is total cynicism. This is the morality of Hell — the devil's theology. And this is why, on communism, the truth not only looks bad, but is indeed bad.

They will pose as reasonable, approachable, jolly folks, given to darning socks and to patting children on the head. We are to be seduced instead of bludgeoned.
