Then came the transfer of the vocation school experiment in 1951 to the Andrews Street building, which had been vacated in 1947 as a parish parochial school. The building is directly in back of Our Lady of Victory Church, which fronts on Pleasant Street.

Since its establishment the school has graduated nearly 100 pupils. Some are serving and have served in the armed forces. The majority have permanent employment. Personal contact is maintained with graduates.
