AMONG WOMEN Methods In Child Supervision

The vagaries of New York weather to which we have been subjected during the past few months suggest an analogy in the area of child care.

Supervision in the home means the state of watching over an individual. It postulates that a parent should know what his children are doing, where and with whom they are spending their leisure time both at home and away from home.

When parents become concerned over the moral climate in which they find their children growing up they try to strike out at outside forces; for instance periodically we find late letters in our papers and magazines urging all manner of drastic action for improving moral conditions.

A FEW MINUTES conversation with an individual engaged in any kind of work with young people will generally produce the phrase "too much permissiveness." Guidance counselors in the schools often attribute the maladjustment of the child in the school to excessive permissiveness on the part of the home.

But to return to our main thought, I have noticed that the same line of reasoning used by parents who lavish all manner of toys and play equipment upon their children. Almost invariably the doting parent was an underprivileged child who tries to re-live vicariously his own childhood in his offspring.
