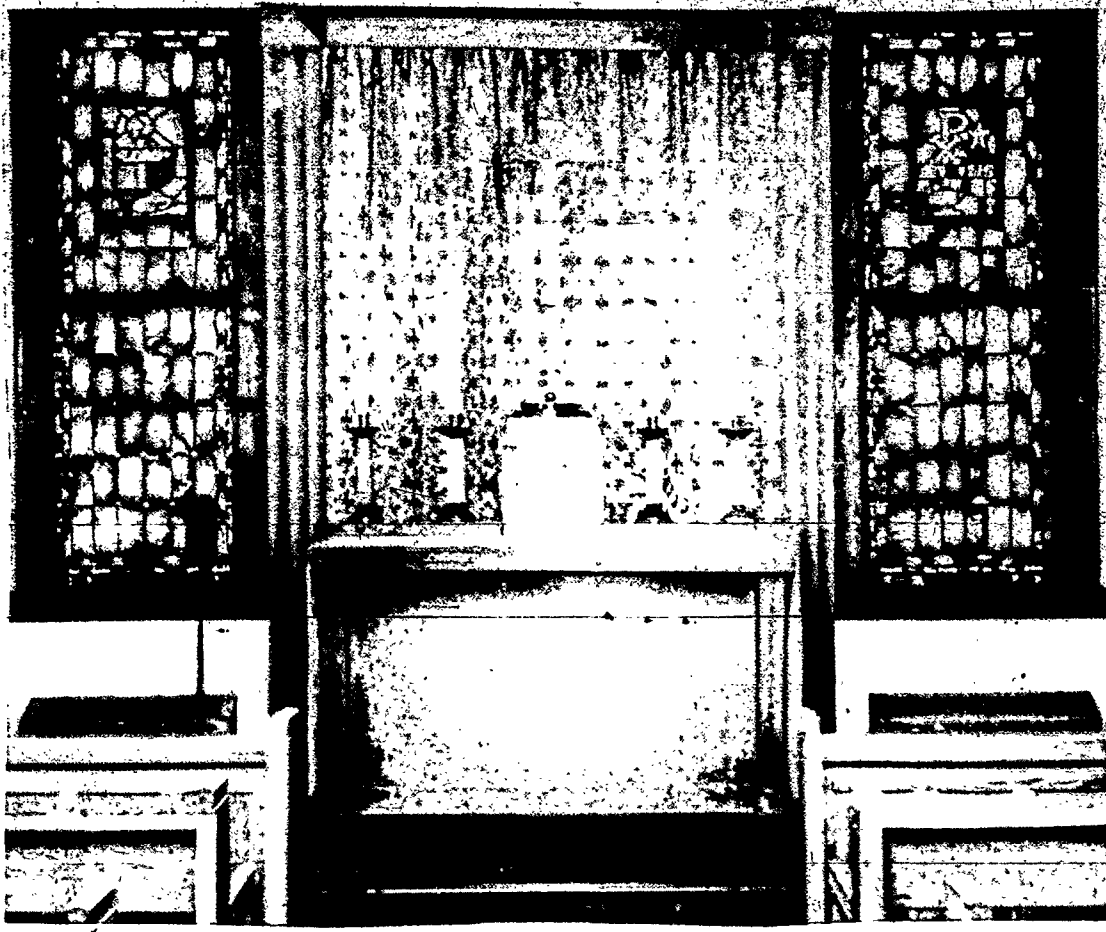


Academy Seeks Funds For Refurbished Chapel

An appeal for funds to help defray the cost of the newly refurbished Our Lady Chapel at Nazareth Academy, 1001 Lake Ave. was launched this week by the Academy's Parent Teacher Association with completion of the work on the chapel.

The new chapel was designed and executed by William J. Woerner and Sons of Rochester. The most important innovation is the complete turnabout in the chapel layout with the altar made the focal point of interest.

THE ALTAR, pews and reredos are of light finished oak as are the candlesticks, each bearing a liturgical symbol of the Holy Family.

Stained glass windows incorporating the school motto were executed from a design by Sister St. Margaret, S.S.J. of the academy facility. Corpus of the crucifix is a hand-carved, imported figure.

During the past several years the Parent Teacher Association has helped in improving the "face" of the Academy grounds with the razing of the former Glass House that had for many years served the early students of the academy and Nazareth College.

Interior improvements at the school were completed recently. Any alumna presently returning to the academy would be pleased to note the improvements to the school building in modernizing to meet present day needs.

THE ENTIRE SCHOOL was repainted, new steel lockers provided for the students, new offices opened with modern steel furniture, a complete new student recreation room added and an audio-visual room equipped.

The Chapel of Our Lady was refurbished and beautified. The cost of the chapel improvement approximates \$4,000 and the Parent-Teacher Association of the Academy has undertaken the responsibility of realizing this amount for the Sister of St. Joseph.

James Hubert, president of the association, has mailed an appeal for funds to all parents of present and former students, all alumnae of Nazareth requesting them to join in contributing "to this worthy cause."

IN CONNECTION with the appeal the association is also planning to hold two fun nights activities on Friday, April 13 and Friday, April 20. Chair rental for each of these affairs will be \$1.00 per night.

The fun nights are this year replacing the annual card party of the association.

Mr. and Mrs. Burton Walker are chairman of fun night activities and are assisted by the members of the Academy Board of Directors.

The "finishing fund" will begin to aid the Carmelites in completing the nearly-finished Monastery on Jefferson Road on May 23. The structure, expected to be tenable by mid-May, requires a few "finishing touches." Thus, for the first time in their 28-year Rochester history, the Carmelites are seeking financial aid from the Catholics of the Rochester Diocese.

WILLIAM A. LANG, president of the Rochester Transit Corporation, reported the appointment of five division leaders to assist him in the campaign: Miss Helen Costello, Mrs. Joseph Schnorr and Mrs. Lewis Boyce to head the women's divisions. A chairman for the Special Gifts Committee, and leaders for the men's division will be announced shortly.

A steering committee which has been working on the organizational plans for the past several weeks, includes the Rt. Rev. Msgr. John S. Randall, Leo Waldert, Frank McConville, Harry B. Crowley, William J. McLaughlin, Theodore Lemm, Otto Schultz, Robert G. Wright and Martin Q. Moll.

In accepting the chairmanship of the forthcoming Carmelite Monastery "Finishing Fund," Lang said: "It is truly amazing that the Carmelite nuns have been able, without public fundraising campaigns, to construct such an impressive and beautiful structure that is nearing completion."

"The nuns of the Carmelite Monastery have pinched and scraped for years to accomplish their goal. Now that it is so near, I know everyone will want to help them in the last few, important stages. Their zeal in praying for others deserves the enthusiastic support of all of us."

"We have selected the period of May 2nd to June 4th for the campaign, and while the quota is relatively small, it will command the time of a great many loyal supporters."

Holy Childhood School Drive Set Next Week

Funds will be sought throughout the Rochester area next week for a unique and successful experiment in education — the School of the Holy Childhood, located in the former Our Lady of Victory School building at 215 Andrews St.

Friends of this vocational center for exceptional children will be asked to contribute to the operating expenses of the institution, which provides specialized training for children who find it impossible to cope fully with the standard program of academic studies.

CITY COURT Judge Thomas P. Culhane and former Children's Court Judge Thomas J. Meagher have organized the campaign committee, which is headed by John M. Hedges and Thomas G. Farrell as co-chairmen. The committee's kickoff meeting is scheduled at 8 p.m. Monday, April 16 at the school.

Serving as division leaders are William Toohay, Frederick Clark, Frederick Preston, Mrs. Morgan Smith, Mrs. Lewis Dellinger, Jr. and Mrs. Frank McKenna. Campaign headquarters may be contacted through Baker 5509.

Operating at capacity with 102 pupils from 6 to 18 years of age, the School of the Holy Childhood is staffed by three Sisters of St. Joseph, six fulltime lay instructors and several parttime teachers. Sister M. St. Mark, S.S.J., its founder, is principal.

PUPILS ARE provided with a three-fold program of social adjustment, vocational training and (Continued on Page 8)
