St. Bernard Grad Participates In Chapel Dedication

A participant in the dedication of the newest outpost on the modern frontier of the faith in the Diocese of Florida was a graduate of St. Bernard Seminary, Rochester, class of 1946, the Rev. Robert W. Schiefen, native of Rochester.

The Chapel of St. Bernard on Atina Maria Island was blessed by Archbishop Joseph P. Hurley. The dedication recalled that the portable cruciform church was erected near the site where Catholic explorers landed in 1539 in the Hernando de Soto expedition.

Archbishop Hurley was presented to a congregation of 400 persons at the blessing and Mass by Father Schiefen who attends the Anna Maria Beach chapel from St. Joseph Parish, Bradenton.

When expansion of the parish requires a permanent church, Father Schiefen said, the building just dedicated can be converted into classrooms for the beginning of a parish school.

Anna Maria Key, which only 20 years ago was the location of a handful of cottages in a jungle setting, has grown fast in population.

The slender island of Anna Maria stretches along the Gulf of Mexico, lying south of Tampa Bay, and is one of the many sand and shell islands bordering Florida's west coast.

Father Schiefen is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Gerald F. Schiefen, formerly of Rochester and was ordained Oct. 20, 1946 in St. Ambrose Church, Rochester.
