The apparitions took place on Aug. 21, 1879 and many miracles have been recorded at the Shrine which is known as "Our Lady's Irish Shrine". However, very little was known about the shrine for many years and it was not until 1939 that a commission was appointed to verify statements from the two surviving witnesses and from people who have been cured by Our Lady of Knock.

In 1936 a medical bureau was set up to examine all claims of miracles and buildings for invalids has since been erected.

THE DEVOTION to Our Lady of Knock has spread to this country and a shrine is maintained at the Church of Our Lady of the Scapular on 28th St. in New York City which is under the spiritual direction of the Carmelite Fathers. The last Saturday of each month is set aside for devotions to Our Lady at Shrine and an annual pilgrimage to Knock is led by Father O'Callahan of the order.

Rev. Theodore J. Winterroth, pastor of St. John Church spoke to the group and expressed his appreciation for their splendid support during the past year. He urged them to pattern their lives after that of Our Blessed Mother and to be the real leaders of their American homes.
