Doctor Mat—General Mat

A man who made a success of two careers used to laugh it off with the remark that he "led a dual life." And that he did a life dedicated to medicine and the military.



General Mat Tinely he was known as. He was born in 1891 in the town of Council Bluffs, Iowa, where every Christmas he would mark his bill after "Paid" for patients unable to afford treatments he had given them. "Uncle Mat" he was to the dozens of nieces and nephews and their children who found in him a contemporary no matter how great the age span.

WHEN WORD came recently of General Mat's death at the age of 64, the military turned out full force. Many and poignant were the memories of General Mat. Then "Lieutenant Mat" in the Spanish American War and "Colonel Mat" in World War I during which on his 41st birthday he was awarded the Croix de Guerre. In command of the 168th of the Rainbow Division he also won the French Military Medal, the American Distinguished Service Medal and the French Legion of Honor.

These honors he took to heart but one trace of the military which he carried into civilian life was his insistence always that his car should bear the number 168 in honor of his regiment. Those who had served with him told how he had come upon a dying doughboy who was cursing viciously but Colonel Mat helped him to recall the long forgotten "Our Father" how he gave his whipcord pants to a sergeant whose own were mere shreds and how later he drove through a snowstorm to attend the man on his deathbed.

TOWNSPEOPLE remembered the well-known combination of Mat and my favorite. And as a teenager the longing to learn to drive a car. "O.K. Jim" Uncle Mat winked. "Well, hustle through lunch and have a lesson. Meet you out front." His house was next door to the high school and many a session we had in that old Ford during lunch hours. Finally, I knew everything about driving and with a grand swoosh took the car into the garage, ripping off a door. "Well, thanks Jim for leaving the garage intact. Uncle Mat chuckled. "Nevermore have I been cock sure behind the wheel."

"WELL, JIM," Uncle Mat said when this column first began running and I'd been given a medal "looks as though you and I've been getting our names in the papers. Let's watch out that we don't get our pictures in the post office." Personal publicity always reminds me of that.

Last time the Head of the House and I saw Uncle Mat, he and Aunt Lu had planted a new species of tree in their garden. A tree supposed to produce some fantastic fruit at the end of twenty years. "The height of optimism?" he grinned. "Well, somebody will enjoy it."

"Uncle Mat enjoyed the fruit of a wonderful life. Dual? It was a multiple life, and one that will go on in the memories of all who knew him. General Mat—Doctor Mat—Uncle Mat.

Income Tax and Sharing

By Mary Lennon Snyder. With the passing of April 16th we mark the end of the season for expatriated comment on complaints and jokes on the subject of the Income Tax. As the risk of sounding like the worst kind of Pollyanna may I say that we may all be losing an opportunity for good when we assume such a cynical and disgruntled attitude regarding income taxes. When anyone does try to make us pluck some good out of the tax picture, generally the over all good of the country, the need of mighty armies, and the strengthening of the bulwarks against communism are stressed. Some of these worthwhile as they may be, seem far away and dealing with affairs too mighty for most of us to ken. But when we see the good that our nation does for our less endowed countrymen, we should rejoice that we are given an opportunity to share, albeit unknowingly and almost unwillingly, in so many corporal works of mercy. Take, for instance, the child God has sent into this world with less than the usual complement of intelligence. Left in a heartless world, consciously or subconsciously rejected by his parents, misunderstood by his peers, prayed upon by the depraved, his lot in our civilization might be a most unhappy one were it not for the professional interest and care which our tax money provides. OF ALL THE areas in which our tax dollar is spent well, let's consider just the field of social service. Father Keller in his "You Can Change the World" comments: "One of the most powerful reminders of this earnest concern of God for man's welfare in this life is contained in the unusual answer Christ gave to the messengers of John the Baptist who were sent to find out whether or not He was the true Messiah. 'Go and relate to John what you have heard and seen.' Christ declared almost abruptly 'The blind see, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead rise again, the poor have the gospel preached to them' (Matt. 11:4, 5). 'As you will notice, only the last point of the six mentioned in Christ's statement dealt with the strictly spiritual. 'The poor have the gospel preached to them.' But even in that there was a reproach to those who should know better than to neglect to pass on to the poor of the world, the Truth intended for all men. 'THE OTHER five points Christ mentioned concern the physical sufferings of mankind. What a strange, yet wonderful proof to give of His Divinity! He could have given a hundred other testimonies instead of choosing this one. He didn't refer to Himself directly. He spoke only of the effects on others of the flow of God's Love in heaven through Him to afflicted man on earth. 'If God is so solicitous for humanity in their afflictions, how willing we should be to be the human instruments through which the divine compassion is channeled to their fellowmen who need and want it so much.' And we are sharing in this work through our support of social welfare programs. So instead of bitterly bemoaning the loss of certain luxuries which the payment of taxes causes us we should ask Almighty God that we be given the grace to view the income tax laws as a means by which we share, albeit by coercion, our resources with those less fortunate; and perhaps we should also pray that those to whom we entrust our nation's finances use it wisely and well. THUS WE can turn even the paying of income taxes into an occasion for giving glory to God and showing our love for His creatures.
