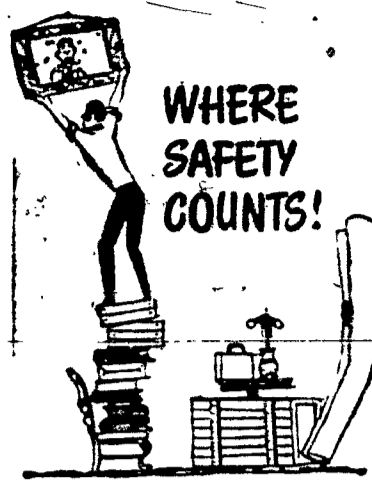
Fashion Show To Be Held For Aquinas Mothers Club
