Sister Hilda Celebrates Golden Anniversary As 'Sister Of Charity'

Sister Hilda of the Daughters of St. Vincent de Paul and head pharmacist at St. Mary's Hospital, Rochester is celebrating her golden jubilee in her Community this week.

Climaxing the observance of Sister Hilda who for 34 of her 70 years as a "Sister of Charity" was head of the pharmacy of the hospital was the celebration by His Excellency Bishop Kearney of Mass at 10 a. m. Wednesday, April 25.

In the afternoon the jubilee was presented with a heart made up of 50 silver dollars, wrapped individually in gold foil, the gift of older employees of the hospital who have been associated with her down through the years. Dr. John Butler presented a gift from the medical staff.

JOINING IN this ceremony in the auditorium were Sisters Hilda's family, visiting Sisters from Buffalo and Syracuse and the employees group.

At the same time a check for \$50 was presented to Sister Martina, hospital administrator to be sent to Sister Inez, former administrator at St. Mary's who is now in Bolivia and will mark her golden jubilee on May 24.

Miss Ann Hebler, nurse supervisor and Thomas Fogarty, chief engineer, who have served the hospital for many years, made the presentations.

The celebration opened on Thursday, April 19 when Mass was celebrated by the Rev. Paul G. Wohlrab, hospital chaplain. At noon, 662 turkey dinners were served to everyone in the hospital including patients, nurses,

doctors and employees. HIGHLY ESTEEMED, Sister Hilda received congratulations and

unheralded charity to the point in the circles is said to be an outstanding feature of her life. Her keen quiet sense of humor is appreciated by all who know her.

Sister Hilda, 72, in her 34 years at St. Mary's Hospital is one of the most beloved persons at the institution.

When she entered the Community in 1906 at Emmitsburg, Md. Sister had no intention of becoming a pharmacist. She taught for six years at Troy and in 1913 a pharmacist was needed and she was picked.

SHE FIRST studied pharmacy in Buffalo and at the age of 29 passed the state examination to receive a druggist's diploma. In 1935 she took a second exam in pharmacy to receive a pharmacist's degree. She has been the chief pharmacist at St. Mary's since 1922 and at first worked alone in the crowded old St. Mary's hospital building.

Now she is in the new quarters and has two other registered pharmacists at the hospital, Miss Alvina Morse and Mrs. Lorene Makowicz and an apprentice, Mrs. Rose Volkman.

An appreciative letter by a staff doctor in congratulating Sister Hilda states in part:

"In spite of our unassigned orders, poor handwriting, wrong dosage and unknown drugs we have ordered, you have served us quietly in your most important capacity."

"Although your pharmacy walls cloister you somewhat from our view, nevertheless we are well aware of you and your vital work in the care of our patients."
