Mother Of Sorrows Convent Drive Slated

General solicitation in the Mother of Sorrows Convent Building Fund Appeal will take place on Sunday, April 29. All parishioners are asked to remain at home for at least two hours after the last Mass at which time the contacts will be made.

Goal of the two hour solicitation is \$200,000 in pledges payable over a 36 month period.

The funds raised will be used to reduce present parish indebtedness and to construct a new convent to replace the present inadequate structure.

MORE THAN 300 men have volunteered their services as workers on the drive. On Thursday, April 26 these volunteers met in the old school for their final instructions.

A kick-off dinner will be held for the men on Saturday, April 28 at 6 p.m. Featured speaker will be His Excellency Auxiliary Bishop Casey. After the dinner the workers kits will be distributed to the men.

Rapid growth of the parish in recent years makes it necessary to expand the school faculty. In

order to house the additional sisters that will be required to care for the increased enrollment, a new Convent is necessary. At present there are eight Sisters of St. Joseph as well as four lay teachers on the staff.

ON THE EVE of the general solicitation, the Rev. Daniel B. O'Rourke, pastor, has expressed the gratitude and confidence of the campaign leaders. "With the co-operation we have had, we cannot fail in our attempt to provide proper living quarters for our Sisters."

General chairman of the drive is Robert Wegman, assisted by David Andrews, William Bell, Arthur Koerner and Leo Sawyko.

500 Workers Hear Bishop Casey At Parish Drive Kick-Off Banquet

Five hundred enthusiastic workers in the St. Margaret Mary Parish school and improvement fund campaign heard His Excellency, Auxiliary Bishop Casey spur them on to exceeding their goal at a "kick-off" dinner last night in Powers Hotel.

The entire project termed the "Father Bruton Memorial Fund," will memorialize the late Rev. Charles J. Bruton, pastor and founder of the parish. The goal is \$375,000.

SUMMING UP the contribution that St. Margaret Mary School is making to the Town of Irondequoit, Bishop Casey paid tribute to the excellent scholastic training the Franciscan Sisters are giving the 876 pupils of the school, and the special emphasis the nuns place on the virtues of politeness, respect and obedience to lawful authority.

The Bishop continued, "The main reason, however, why we Catholics erect separate schools can be summed up in three words - teaching the catechism, teaching the children to know, love and serve God.

"They will not love and serve God until first they learn about Him. That is the chief function of the parochial school, training the children to know and to live their religion."

His genuine generosity of spirit and personal interest in their welfare inspired his people to do their part in making St. Margaret Mary's the parish that it is," Bishop Casey said.

FUNDS GATHERED in the campaign are for improvements in the 26-year-old school and for

other needed alterations, and additions in the parish according to Arthur J. Bazmann, general chairman. Working with him are Co-chairmen Raymond E. Hebert, George D. Bryant, R. Emmett Kilday and Vincent W. Wells.

Plans for an addition to the school drawn by Carl Ade, architect, include six additional classrooms, a Boy Scout room, a Girl Scout room, new kitchen facilities, enlarged boiler facilities, new toilet rooms and shower rooms.

The present school structure will also undergo general renovation and plans are being made to (Continued on Page 6A)
