

Remedial Reading Clinic Slated In Corning School

Corning—Second annual Remedial Reading Clinic in the Corning area is scheduled for July 5 to July 28 according to the Sisters of Mercy, sponsors.

The 20-day sessions will be held in St. Vincent de Paul School between the hours of 9 a. m. and noon each weekday with each of the students participating in an hour long class period.

For the second year, Sister Mary Helena of Our Lady of Mercy Reading Laboratory at Rochester will act as registrar. She will interview parents who wish to register their children.

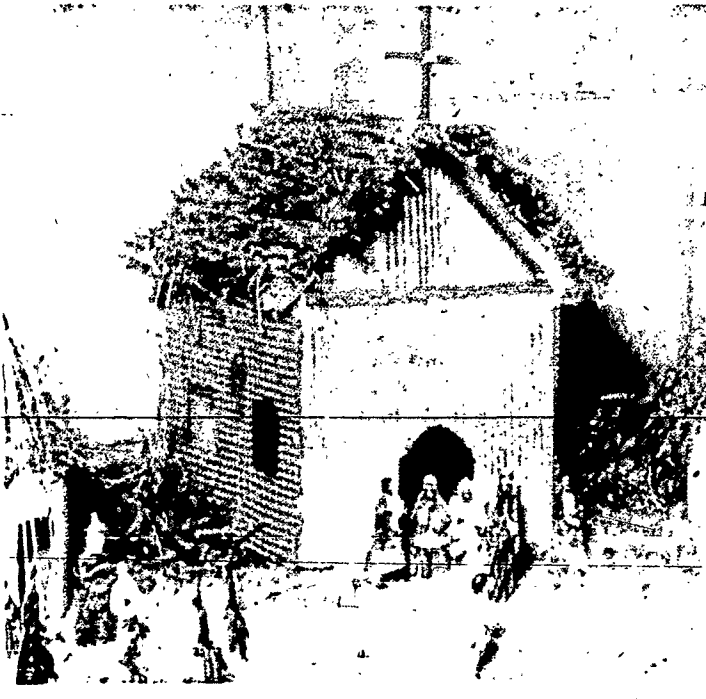
DATES FOR THE REGISTRATION, which is limited to 75 for this year's clinic, will be announced later. Additional information concerning the registration can be obtained by calling Sister Mary Gertrude at St. Vincent's School.

Children of all religious denominations are welcomed at the reading clinic. Both elementary and secondary students will be

admitted to the school with classes limited to five.

The laboratory testing program will include Stanford Binet psychological testing, personality and achievement testing as well as individual reading analysis. Diagnostic services will be followed by guidance interviews, recommendations, tutoring and special group work, all according to the individual needs of each student.

THE TEACHERS for the Testing Center and Reading Clinic have been especially trained for this program and at the suggestion of the State Department of Education have undertaken this work to aid students who have developed difficulty in reading. Recent studies have indicated that these special clinics have been of great usefulness to a large percentage of students.

Throng Attends Eastern Rite Mass In Corning

Corning—St. Vincent de Paul's Church was filled to capacity last Sunday morning at 10:30 when the Rev. Alexander P. Maczkov, pastor of Holy Spirit Catholic Church in the Byzantine-Slavonic Rite, in the mass was sponsored by Corning Council, Knights of Columbus, with Grand Knight Thomas E. Kelley and past Grand Knight Paul Tammaro heading the committee. The Rev. Ralph Thomas, S. A. of St. John's Atonement Seminary, Montour Falls, was honorary chairman.

One of the highlights of the ceremonies was the singing of the 53-voice Holy Spirit choir who sang the Divine Liturgy in Slavonic under the direction of choirmaster John J. Kapral.

In the eastern churches, the Mass is called the Divine Liturgy and has some variation from the ceremonies of the Latin Rite, including the serving of Holy Communion in both forms—bread and wine.

"What the Knights of Columbus have accomplished by bringing this rite here today," the Father Maczkov told the parishioners, "is carrying out the intent of Pope Pius XII, who has requested that Catholics, with 22 different rites using 12 different languages get to know about each other."

He added that they are all Catholics, subject to the Pope, but understanding each other's customs would strengthen their bond.

Father Maczkov said that over nine million Catholics today use the Byzantine-Slavonic Rite, which is over 1,500 years old.

Following the church service, a luncheon for more than 300 persons was served in St. Vincent's parish hall where they heard several special selections from the choir.
