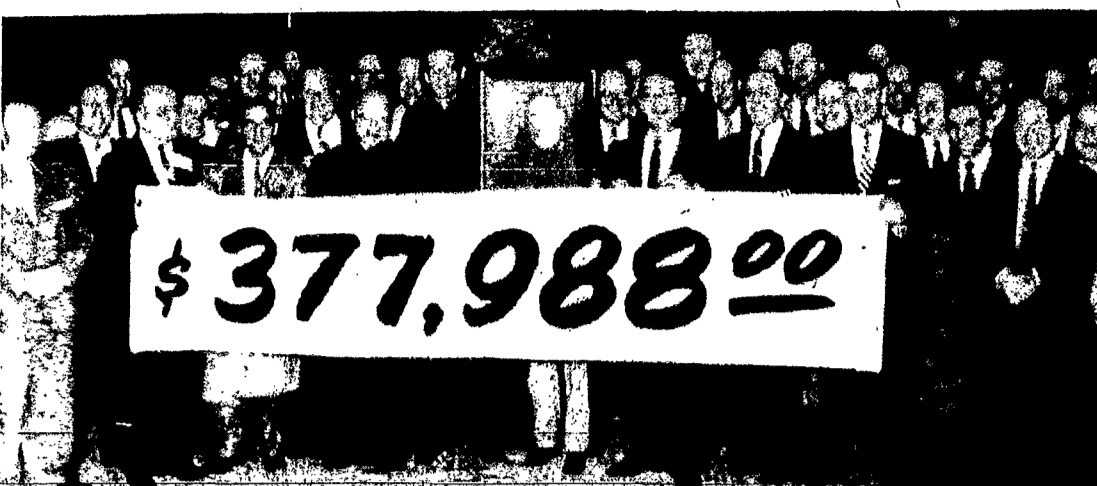

Brockport Native, Parish Plans Dinner Brother Cargos Funeral Held

Funeral services for Brother Joseph H. Cargos, S.M., were conducted at the Marianna Preparatory Seminary and St. John's Church in Beacon, N.Y. on Monday, May 7.

Brother Joseph died of May 4, 1954 at St. Anthony's Hospital, Woodhaven, N.Y. after a short illness.

Born in Brockport, he entered the Society of Mary in 1893 and made his religious profession the following year. Brother Joseph had spent 4 years in the teaching profession, 30 of them as principal.

SINCE HIS retirement from teaching in 1949, Brother Joseph had been at the Marianna Preparatory Seminary in Beacon, N.Y., where he held the post of accountant until September, 1953. In his spare time he continued to work at his lifetime hobby of making rosaries.

Survivors are his brothers Charles John and August Cargos of Rochester and several nieces, including Sister Mary Gerard of Nazareth College and nephews.

Burial was held in the cemetery on the campus of the University of Dayton, Dayton, Ohio.

Dr. Kelly To Address Physicians Breakfast

Dr. Francis W. Kelly, physician in charge, Brigham Hall Hospital, Canandaigua and outstanding Catholic psychiatrist will address the Catholic Physicians Guild of Rochester at the third annual Communion breakfast on Sunday, May 20.

The breakfast and annual meeting will be held in Parlor A adjoining the chapel of Columbus Civic Center following Mass at 8 a.m.

DOCTOR KELLY who will speak on "Catholicism and Psychiatry" is a graduate of St. John University, Brooklyn where he earned a B.S. degree in 1935 and of Long Island College of Medicine where he attained his M.D. degree in 1939.

After interning at Mary Immaculate he was Psychiatrist Resident at Brooklyn State and Veterans Administration and held a fellowship in psychiatry at the Institute of Living at Hartford.

During World War 2 he was chief of Psychiatric Service at Kelly Field, Texas. After the war he served as superintendent of the Brandon State School and was instructor in Psychiatry at the University of Vermont Medical School from 1947 to 1951.

SINCE 1951 he has been physician in charge of Brigham Hall Hospital and consultant psychiatrist at the Frederick Ferris Thompson Hospital Canandaigua.
