Getting The Most From Meetings

A common complaint voiced at sometime or other by each one of us is that we are sick and tired of meetings. Recently, in an attempt to re-vitalize a member in whose eye I saw the symptoms of boredom with the whole idea of one particular organization, I said, with conviction and sincerity, "But the meetings are fun."

"Let us then hold our regular meetings. Our Lord made use of a similar method in establishing His Church; He sent His disciples two by two into the country, then He called them back and gathered them together, and conversed with them on all that had been done and on all that was yet to be done; and then He sent them out again. The Apostles did in like manner and the Church still uses this method in its general and provincial councils and its synods." In this spirit the manual of the Ladies of Charity admonishes, "To draw the utmost fruit from these meetings the members should attend in the proper dispositions; and first the spirit of piety; they should attend with the desire to reanimate their fervor, to derive greater courage and new light (from the instructions). It is God Himself who speaks to them through these various agencies."

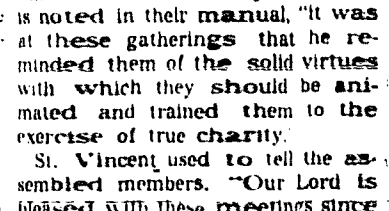
Rose Mathews Listed For May 13 Recital

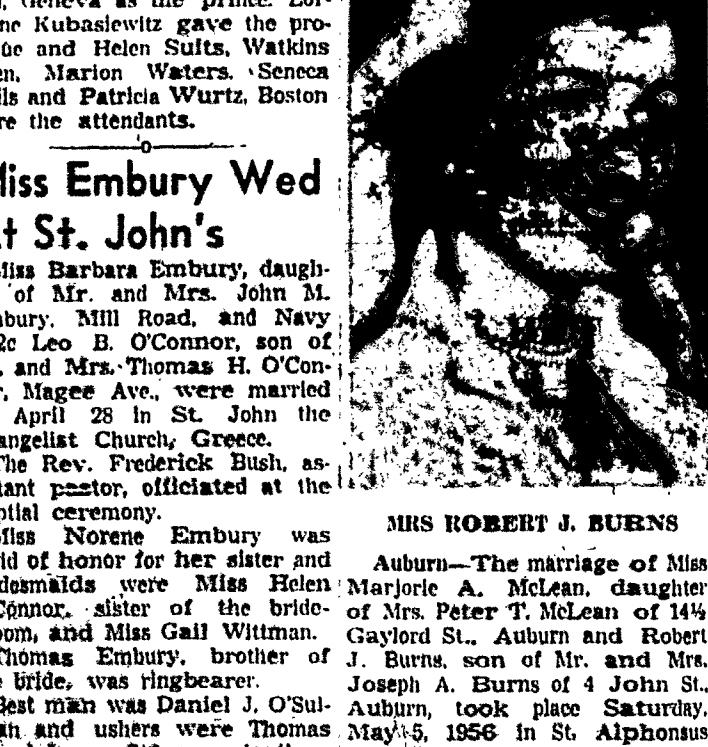
