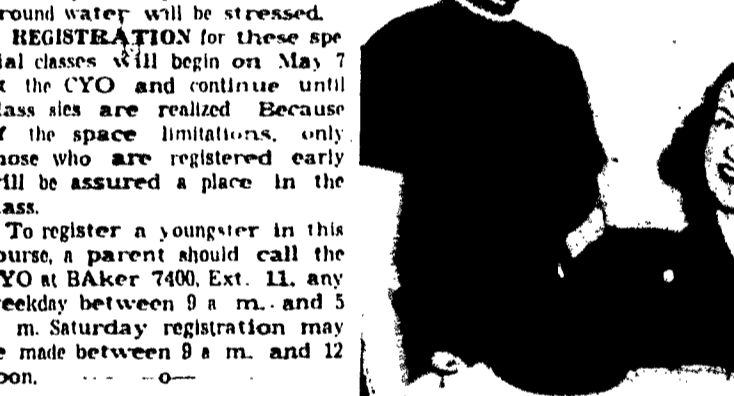


Winners At Science Fair
