## Rites In Cathedral, St. Mary's, Auburn To Raise Young Men To Priesthood

Sixteen young men will be raised to the priesthood in two ordination ceremonies, June 9 and 16. His Excellency, Bishop James E. Kearney will ordain fourteen priests at Sacred Heart Cathedral Saturday, June 9, at 9 a.m. His Excellency Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey will ordain two more priests at St. Mary's Church, Auburn, Saturday, June 16, also at 9 a.m. ALL OF THE NEW priests will celebrate their first Solemn Masses on the Sunday immediately after their ordination in their respective parish churches. (See article on this page for details.) Fifteen of the young men who will be ordained in the June ceremonies are for the Diocese of Rochester. One will be ordained for the Diocese of Tucson, Arizona.

The fifteen priests to be ordained for the Rochester Diocese are members of the 1956 Ordination Class of St. Bernard's Seminary. These to be ordained at the Cathedral include thirteen Rochester area residents and one from Corning. The two who will be ordained at Auburn are residents of that city. **Pope Greets President's Doctor**  
Vatican City — (NC) — His Holiness Pope Pius XII greets Dr. Paul Dudley White during a special audience granted a group of heart specialists at the Vatican. Dr. White, famed Boston heart specialist who attended President Eisenhower after his heart attack, was a speaker at the dedication of the 2-million dollar "House for the Relief of Suffering" at San Giovanni Rotondo, Italy, commonly known as Padre Pio's hospital, which took ten years to build. **Holy Father Sees 'Inner Peace Of Mind' Means To Reduce Heart Disease Toll**  
Vatican City — (RNS) — Pope Pius XII told a group of doctors here that "inner peace of mind" through religion is the best means to reduce the high frequency of death from heart disease in this modern age. He spoke in French at an audience to heart specialists from many countries who had attended a symposium on cardiology at Rotondo, a mountain village near Foggia in south Italy.

**OTHER MEANS** suggested by the Pontiff to ward off the danger of sudden death from heart disease were: moderation in everything, a reasonable alternation of work and rest, and control of emotional life. He said that if medicine was to be "truly humane," it must consider the individual in his entirety — body and soul. "Bodily pain," the Pope said, "affects man as a whole down to the deepest layers of his moral being. It forces him to face again the fundamental questions of his fate, of his attitude toward God and his fellowmen, of his individual and collective responsibility and of his pilgrimage on earth."

**AMONG THOSE** received by Pope Pius XII was Dr. Paul Dudley White of Boston, who attended President Eisenhower after he was stricken with coronary thrombosis last year. In a personal talk with the American specialist, the Pontiff expressed his gratification at President Eisenhower's recovery. The doctors had gathered at Rotondo to mark the inauguration here of a new 500-bed hospital started in 1947 with funds granted by the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration. The institution is named for the late **PRECIOUS BLOOD SCHOOL** — New link in the chain of diocesan parish schools is the Most Precious Blood School on Seneca Street, Rochester. Formal blessing of the building was conducted Sunday by His Excellency Bishop Kearney. 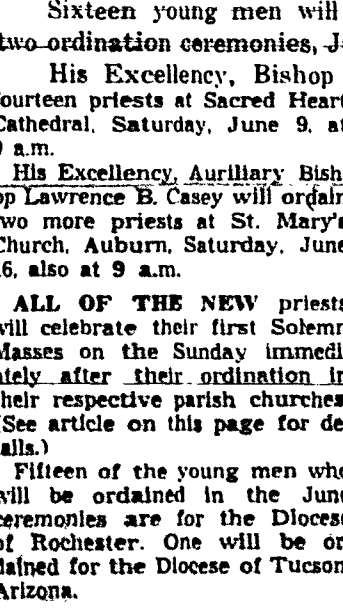

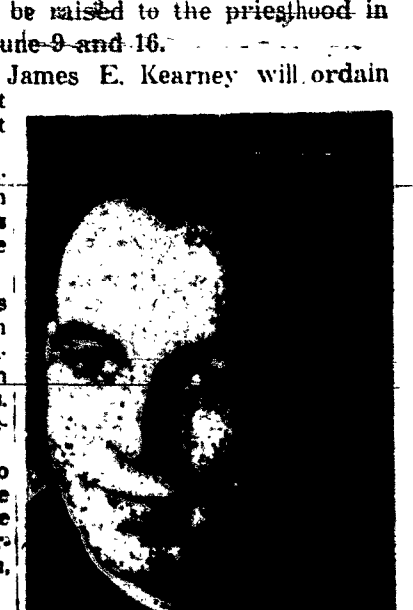
