### Mercy Sisters To Conduct Reading Lab

The summer sessions of the Reading Laboratory conducted by the Sisters of Mercy will be held from July 5 to 28 at Our Lady of Mercy High School and at St. Thomas School in Irondequoit.

Students from second grade through high school may register for a daily one-hour class. A testing program including the Stanford-Binet I.Q. personality and a reading achievement test assists the staff in individual diagnosis, and facilitates placement. Students receive instruction in groups of six or seven according to ability and needs, with occasional tutoring and private guidance as the case requires. REMEDIAL SPEECH will be offered also for students in need of analysis and therapy. Registration will be held the second week of June at Our Lady of Mercy High School. Hours to be announced later. Parents of new students are requested to come to the Reading Laboratory for an interview during the week of registration. This is the fifth summer that the Reading Laboratory has been functioning, and according to Sister Mary de Pazzi, director, the enrollment has always met the capacity dictated by the size of the staff. The laboratory is in session six days a week through out the year. Further information may be obtained by telephone contact with Sister Mary Helena, registrar.
