Richard Kurz Appointed Editor Of Fisher Yearbook

Richard Karl Kurz, a junior at St. John Fisher College was appointed the new editor-in-chief of the college yearbook, the "Jo Roffs", succeeding James W. Gallagher.

Kurz is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Karl Kurz of 264 West Craig Hill Drive in St. John the Evangelist Parish, Greece. He attended St. Margaret Mary School and Aquinas Institute.

While at Aquinas Kurz was appointed editor-in-chief of the Aquinas and Lumb Honorary Societies. He was awarded the Francis A. Award for outstanding scholastic achievement in the field of science.

Geneva — One hundred and eighty-five members of the Geneva Council, Knights of Columbus heard Maj. Gen. Wycliff Steele, Sampson Air Base Commandant and a recent convert to Catholicism, speak at the annual Council breakfast held at Hotel Seneca last Sunday.

The general commented that the first and second generation Americans make top citizens, so do converts to a religion often understand and practice it more fully than those who were born into it.

"My religion," the general said, "has given me great peace of mind and a true enjoyment of life."
