St. Agnes Rosary Society Hears Monsignor Maney

Avon — More than 150 members of the Rosary Society of St. Agnes Church heard an address on the "Queenship of Mary" by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. John E. Maney, chancellor of the Diocese, at the annual banquet May 8 at the Avon Inn.

Monsignor Maney pointed out to those present that it was most approp to speak on the "Queenship of Mary" because this was the month of May dedicated, in a special way, to the Mother of God. "It is most fitting," the speaker said, "that we pay tribute to the Queen of all Queens especially at this time when so many are chosen to participate as Queens of various festivals throughout the length and breadth of our land."

During the dinner vocal selections were rendered by Miss Rosalie Sheilin accompanied at the piano by Miss Vivian Emery, both students at the Eastman School of Music, Rochester.

MONSIGNOR MANEY developed in a striking fashion the genuine prerogatives of Mary underlying Her "Queenship" and the part in man's Redemption. Mary was definitely associated with Christ in the acquisition of redemptive grace and the distribution of grace, he said.

"In the cycle of man's fall, original sin was committed by Adam, consummated by Eve, and transmitted through Eve. In the supernatural order, the cycle is identical. Redemption was begun by Mary, consummated by Christ, and transmitted through Mary. The facets of her Queenship are like the facets of a diamond. Every century of Christianity has paid tribute to this Queen."

Dr. Maney alluded to and illustrated Her titles of Queen as contained in ancient prayers; Queen of Angels, Queen of Patriarchs, Queen of Prophets, Queen of Apostles, Queen of Martyrs, Queen of Confessors, Queen of Virgins, Queen of all Saints, Queen conceived without original sin, Queen of the most holy Rosary, Queen of Peace.

"The inspiration of Her Queenship is found in the masterpieces of art, literature, and sculpture.

Gems of architecture in vast edifices dedicated to God bearing Her titles dot the lands of the world. Our own Nation, shall have at Washington, D.C. the very pulse of our government, a vast basilica with Her as Patroness, a tribute to Her, and to the millions who by their sacrifices, made this possible, inspired by their love of this Queen, Patroness of the Land they cherish," he continued.

Monsignor Maney asked those present to rededicate themselves to the Queen of heaven and earth, to renew their filial devotion to this powerful advocate at the throne of the Almighty.

In the words of St. Bernard he assured them that no one having recourse to Her would go unaided. "Let Her be your consolation, your strength, your protection in the voyage of life. Under her protective mantle all would be brought safely to the shores of eternity," he concluded.
