**Holy Shroud Lecture Given, St. Agnes HN Slate Named**

The Rev. Adam J. Otterbein, C.S.S.R., founder and president of the Holy Shroud Guild gave an illustrated lecture on the Holy Shroud of Turin to the Holy Name Society of St. Agnes parish, Avon on Thursday evening, May 17.

Meeting was held at Wally's Inn, East Avon. IN CONCLUDING his lecture, Father Otterbein said, "there is a dignity and a majesty in that Face of the Holy Shroud which you would not expect in the face of a man who had undergone the tremendous sufferings which are indicated in the rest of the imprint."

"And yet," he added, "it is the dignity and the majesty which we would expect in the Face of the Son of God, who voluntarily laid down His life and was about to take it up again."

BOTH THE FOSTER, the Rev. Charles E. Muckle, S.T.B., and the Rev. Edward A. Shamoa, assistant pastor, were present for the lecture and meeting.

FATHER MUCKLE exhorted the Holy Name men to keep the Face of the Holy Shroud of Turin before their minds as "a powerful deterrent from sin in times of temptation." Cautioning the men regarding one of the main purposes of the Society, Father Shamoa encouraged them at all times to pay due honor and respect to the august name of God and His Divine Son.
