Socialists Plan May Day Rites

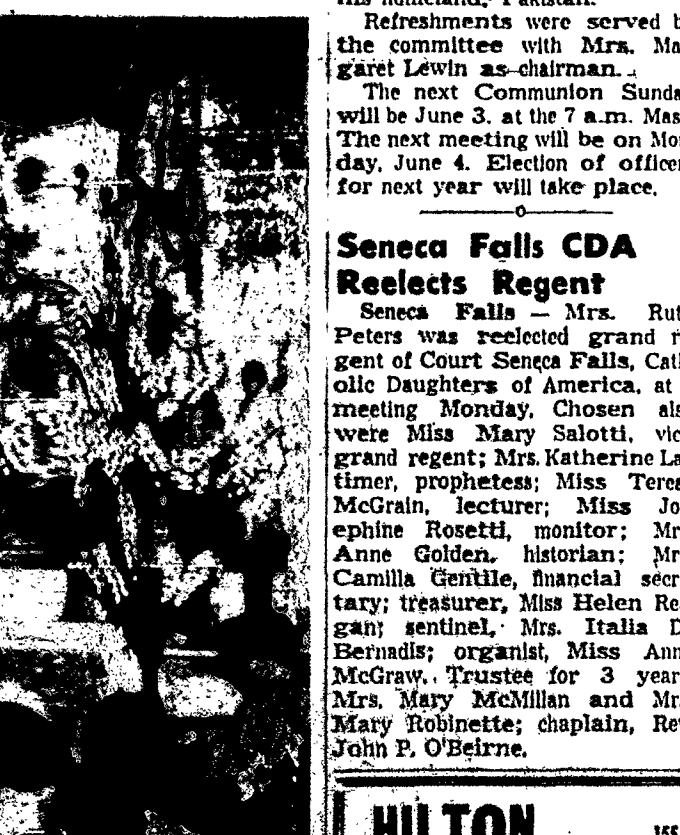
