

Youth Earns Scouting Honor Despite Handicap
 Many obstacles stood in the path of Arnold "Buddy" Madigan, 17, in his quest for the Eagle Scout Award. To qualify for the award, he had to pass such tests as lifesaving, swimming and various athletic events.
 The tests were difficult for all boys, but Buddy had an added handicap—he had only one arm.
COURAGE AND determination to overcome his handicap led to his final goal last Sunday. At a Court of Awards held for troops 37 at St. John the Evangelist Parish, Rochester, Buddy was presented the scouting's highest award by Harold Ecker, former scoutmaster. Jack Gentner, scoutmaster, presided.
 A senior at Aquinas Institute, Buddy is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Martin Madigan, 225 Akron St.
 Buddy is believed to be the first boy in Rochester, who has a serious physical handicap to receive the Eagle award.
