St. Cecilia Drive Tops Goal With \$195,653

Pledges totaling \$195,653—more than \$70,000 over the minimum goal—were reported last Sunday in the financial need appeal campaign conducted in St. Cecilia Parish, Irondequilt, in a two-hour parish-wide canvass Sunday, May 20.

The Rev. Bernard C. Newcomb, pastor, expressed his heartfelt thanks to all parishioners for their sacrifice and generosity in the appeal, and termed it another example of "the excellent cooperation which always has been exhibited by the people of our parish."

The three-year pledges were sought for a threefold purpose—the addition of four classrooms and a nurse's room to the present nine-classroom school building, the construction of a second floor and chapel on the convent building, and reduction of the parish debt. Pledge payments will begin Sunday, June 3, the pastor said.

GROWING POPULATION and increasing school enrollment necessitate added construction, Father Newcomb pointed out. The school, with 467 pupils, now conducts one class in the church basement, and enrollment is expected to reach 500 in September. Ground will be broken soon for the school addition. Staffing the school are eight Sisters of Mercy and two lay teachers.

General chairman of the fund campaign committee were Edmund J. Costich and George B. McAvoy. Edward F. Kelly, Earl W. McKechney and Raymond F. Schipper were vice-chairmen. Advanced gifts were handled by a committee headed by Anthony Wentis, Cletus Hengstler and Bernard Schum, and Kenneth A. Butler and John J. Kaveny were co-chairmen of the advisory committee. Assisting in direction of the campaign was Arthur P. Farney, representing Foley Associates Inc., a Rochester fund-raising organization.
