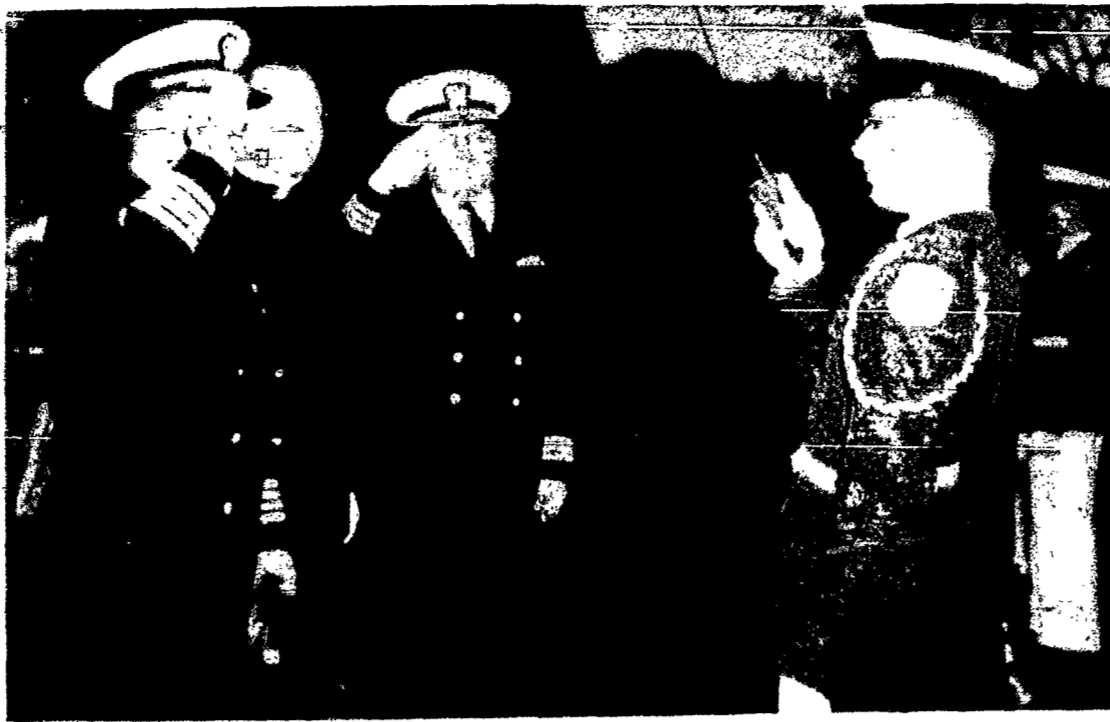


### Father Williams To Speak
