Diplomas and pins were presented by His Excellency Bishop Kearney to 34 nursing school and three X-ray school graduates. Bishop Kearney was principal commencement speaker.

"It is a most appropriate time and place for your graduation," the Bishop said. "Today, Holy Mother Church celebrates the Feast of the Most Blessed Trinity. Since all important undertakings are begun by invoking the aid of the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, it is fitting that the nurses should launch their career on this feast day."
