

Msgr. Freking Listed At Aquinas Assembly

The Rt. Rev. Msgr. Edward A. Freking of Cincinnati, National Secretary of the Catholic Students' Mission Crusade will address Aquinas Institute study body at the Final Mission Assembly on Friday, June 8, today.

Monsignor Freking's subject will be "The Challenge to American Youth to Spread the Kingdom of God." He will be presented by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. John S. Randall, Diocesan Director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith.

WIDELY KNOWN for his work with youth and the Catholic Students' Mission Crusade, Monsignor Freking is in great demand as a speaker. He delivered the opening sermon at the World Mission Scenerama in Rochester last fall. He is in charge of the CSMC National Convention slated in August at Notre Dame University.

It is expected that another new record for Aquinas Mission activity will be announced, according to the Rev. John Wilson, C.S.B. Mission Moderator.

Final Public View Of New Carmelite Monastery Listed

Rochesterians will get their last look at the cloistered areas of the new Carmelite Monastery in Jefferson Road and their last opportunity to share in the completion of the edifice over the coming weekend.

Because of the turnaway crowds at the new monastery over the last weekend, the doors will be open to the public again on Saturday and Sunday from 2 to 6 p.m. A staff under Theodore J. Houck will be in charge.

This will mark the final chance for a public view of the cloistered areas which will be available only to the Carmelite nuns when they move in toward the end of this month.

MORE THAN 10,000 men, women and children inspected the unique setup last weekend. Many more were unable to gain entrance because of crowds and traffic. To accommodate these people the decision was made to extend the inspection to the coming weekend, according to the Rt. Rev. Msgr. John S. Randall, chaplain at Carmel.

Meanwhile campaign workers in the finishing fund drive for the new monastery came within an eyelash of their \$94,262 goal this week by raising \$90,536. Because of the many contacts still to be made, especially among the men's teams, the drive will continue through Monday, June 11, according to General Chairman William A. Lang.

At Monday's final dinner in the Immaculate Conception Auditorium, Herman G. Hetzler, honorary chairman of the drive, will play host to the division leaders, team captains and workers and members of the special gifts committee.

TWO OF THE three women's divisions and the special gifts committee went over the top at this week's report dinner. Heading the entire campaign army was the division led by Miss Helen L. Costello which reported \$23,787 for 152 percent of quota.

Mrs. Joseph E. Schnorr reported \$20,498 for 137 percent of quota while Mrs. Lewis J. Boyce's division just missed its \$15,000 quota with \$14,254 for 95 percent. Harry B. Crowley, Jr. reported \$3,158 for 34 percent.

Newly Consecrated Auxiliary Bishop In Los Angeles Has Relatives Here

Consecration of the Most Rev. Aiden John Bell as Titular Bishop of Rhodopolis and Auxiliary to His Eminence James Francis Cardinal McIntyre, Archbishop of Los Angeles in St. Vibiana Cathedral in California Monday has special significance to his three aunts who reside in Rochester.

Bishop Bell, a native of Peterborough, Ont., Canada, was ordained to the Holy Priesthood, 24 years ago in the Los Angeles Cathedral and on Monday was consecrated by Cardinal McIntyre with Coadjutor Bishop Joseph T. McGucken of Sacramento and Auxiliary Bishop Timothy Manning of Los Angeles.

The newly elevated Bishop is the son of Mrs. Catherine Marie Bell and the late Henry Harold Bell. He also has an uncle here, Lionel R. Bell.

Bishop Bell, a South Pacific War veteran, prior to his elevation was administrator of St. Vibiana's and Archdiocesan Director of Charities.

Msgr. Bernard J. Dolan, pastor of St. Anthony's Church, Long Beach, Calif., who preached the sermon in the Cathedral, declared that Bishop Bell "will have need in a very real way of the weapons which symbolized the consecration ceremony — the breastplate of justice, the helmet of salvation, the sword of truth."

AT BISHOP BELL'S side during the consecration was his brother, Father Percy Bell, who 35 years ago sold papers with the Bishop on the same Los Angeles corner and later followed him into the seminary. In front news flanking his mother, Mrs. Bell, were five more of the Bishop's brothers and their wives. To them the new Bishop gave his first blessing at the conclusion of the ceremonies.
