Slovak Seminarians'

Death Tower' Job Spare Fathers

Vatican City — (NC) — A group of Catholic seminarians volunteered for work in the "death tower" of a uranium processing plant in a Red Czechoslovak prison camp to replace fathers of families who had been condemned to work there. The heroism of the seminarians was described in an account of his concentration camp experiences given by a Protestant minister, the Rev. Joseph Moj of Kraslice, broadcast by Vatican Radio. Telling of life in the Vikmanov forced labor camp, Pastor Moj said that all the prisoners dreaded the time when they would have to work in the uranium processing plant. The air filters were inefficient, he said, and the air was full of radioactive dust. "If one worked there for a while," the minister continued, "it was difficult to avoid fatal consequences to one's health. Therefore I was more than surprised when I heard that some Slovak seminarians had volunteered for this work. They had taken the place of others in the death tower with the simple statement that they wished to replace fathers of families whose

wives and children were waiting for them."

THE GESTURE of the seminarians bore great fruit among the other prisoners, Pastor Moj said. He added that even the guards and police were highly impressed by the heroism.

The Bohemian minister said he was with a group of 16 Catholic seminarians and some other Christians who were sent to Vikmanov. There were already 90 priests in the camp, he said, and "the welcome the priests gave us on our arrival was more than moving."

"I was helped by a Franciscan Father from Moravia," he continued. "He had been sentenced to 25 years' imprisonment, having been accused of anti-Marxist propaganda. With many other Catholics and non-Catholics from various countries and walks of life, we prayed as brothers and spent many hours in meditation."

Nixon Cites Missioners In Foreign Relations Role

Easton, Pa. — (NC) — Vice President Richard M. Nixon said here the example of Christian missionaries would provide a good basis for study on how to win friends throughout the world.

We could learn a "great deal in our foreign relations by studying their attitudes and methods," the Vice President told graduates of Lafayette College.

HE CITED three acts by which the missionaries were able to be accepted by foreign peoples: "First, 'coming to help the nations to which they were sent, learning the native language and customs, and 'taking literally' the truth that all men are brothers under God. Mr. Nixon also told the graduates that the United States stands on 'the side of freedom and justice, of belief in God — against the forces of slavery, injustice and atheistic materialism."

Cartoonist To Speak On Soil Conservation

Des Moines — (NC) — Tom Kelly, formerly associated with the U. S. Soil Conservation Service, is a new member of the speakers' bureau of the National Catholic Rural Life Conference. The NCRLC announced at its headquarters here. Mr. Kelly, a cartoonist, will give illustrated lectures on soil conservation.

Pope Thanks, Blesses U.S. Catholic Women

Washington, — (NC) — His Holiness Pope Pius XII has found "comfort and consolation" in the knowledge that the National Council of Catholic Women "has made such laudable contribution to the apostolate in the field of Catholic Action." Mrs. August G. Dean of Chicago, president of the NCCW, has been informed.

Acknowledging receipt of a bound volume of the proceedings of the last NCCW convention, Msgr. Angelo Dell'Acqua, Substitute Vatican Secretary of State, has written to Mrs. Dean that the Holy Father "cherishes the prayerful hope that this organization may continue its valued assistance to the work of the Church in the United States of America."

His Holiness imparted "his particular Apostolic Blessing" to the officers and members of the NCCW, Msgr. Dell'Acqua said.

Requiem Offered For Mrs. Knute Rockne

Notre Dame — (NC) — Requiem Mass has been offered in Sacred Heart Church here for Mrs. Knute Rockne, widow of the late football coach at the University of Notre Dame.

More than 400 friends, neighbors, and past and present Notre Dame football followers attended the Mass in the church on the school's campus. Among them were four men who have been head coaches at Notre Dame since Mr. Rockne: Hearty Anderson, Elmer Layden, Frank Leahy and the incumbent Terry Brennan.

Burial was in the family plot at Highland Cemetery where Mr. Rockne was buried after his death in a Kansas plane crash 25 years ago.

800 Couples
Santa Barbara, Calif. — (NC) — Eight hundred couples have made weekend retreats at La Casa de Maria retreat house for married couples, the Sisters of the Immaculate Heart announced here on the first anniversary of the house's opening.

Catholic Charities Join N.Y. Agency, Planned Parenthood Group Out

New York — (NC) — The Welfare and Health Council of New York, a social planning and coordinating agency from which Catholic groups withdrew in 1953 on the entry of a planned parenthood group has been supplanted by a new agency, The Greater New York Community Council, Inc. Catholic Charities of New York and Brooklyn are among the twenty-four community organizations which have joined the new council, according to Msgr. George Guilfoyle, executive director of Catholic Charities in New York. The planned parenthood group is not a member of the new council. Among the twenty-four corporate members of the new organization are the Federation

of Jewish Philanthropies, the Federation of Protestant Welfare Agencies, the American Red Cross, the Brooklyn Bureau of Social Service, the community Service Society and the Children's Aid Society.

In 1953, Catholic Charities of New York and Brooklyn and their affiliated agencies withdrew from the old Welfare and Health Council upon the admission of the planned parenthood group.

At that time there were 375 members. Membership in the new Greater New York Community Council, Inc. is limited to the large welfare federations and some of the larger organizations in related fields. Twenty-nine community leaders have been elected to direct the new organization as members of a board of directors. Robert F. Wagner, Mayor of New York City, is honorary chairman of the board.

Panama Stamps To Honor Popes

Panama City — (NC) — The Republic of Panama announced it will issue in July a series of postage stamps honoring the 12 Popes named Pius.

It said the stamps are designed to render homage to His Holiness Pope Pius XII in recognition of his "holiness" — international work for the promotion of peace against the oppressive forces of communism. The government announced last year it plans to release commemorative stamps honoring all the recognized Popes.

St. Helen School Annex Blessed By Bishop Casey

Dedication of an eight-room addition to St. Helen School, Chili by His Excellency, Auxiliary Bishop Casey on Sunday, June 10 assures the parish of a 17-room school with auditorium to accommodate 575 children expected in September.

The new unit added to the original school started in 1947 with four rooms and an auditorium and five added later, cost \$140,000 according to the Rev. J. Beecher Sullivan, pastor. Bishop Casey blessed the new structure Sunday and erected the Crucifix in the corridor. He addressed the parishioners later in the school auditorium commending the work they are doing for their children in helping to extend facilities for sound Catholic education.

Construction of the new unit which conforms in architecture with the existing school building was started last July. The school located on Lettington Drive is in charge of the Sisters of the Order of St. Francis.

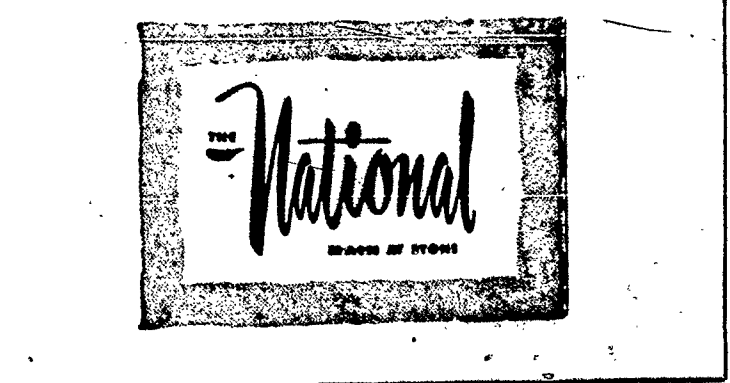
