Bishop Casey To Open \$67,000 Drive For Improvements In Owego Parish

Owego — His Excellency, Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey, will be the keynote speaker Saturday evening at a dinner launching the \$67,000 fund raising campaign for the repair and renovation of the present St. Patrick Church in Owego.

The dinner meeting, beginning at 6:00 p.m., will be held at the Moose Club, 32 Lake Street, Owego.

GENERAL solicitation of all parishioners will take place on Sunday, June 17, between 1:30 and 3:30 p.m., according to J. Edmund Morton, general chairman. Morton also requested all the parishioners to make every effort to remain at home at that time, so that the work of the volunteer solicitors would be made easier.

Plans for the renovation of the St. Patrick Church, according to the Rev. William J. O'Brien, pastor, include:

A completely new heating system to replace the present outmoded one. The purchase of a main altar and two side altars, new sacristy and vestment cases, carpeting for the sacristy, sanctuary, and body of the church. Replacing and renovation of the present stained glass windows, and purchase of new windows for the vestibule of the church. New main entrance doors will be installed as will two new confessionals.

THE INTERIOR of the church will be redecorated, the organ and choir loft will be repaired and renovated, and the cleaning and repainting of the Stations of the Cross will be undertaken. Present plans call for the enlargement and modernization of the kitchen and church hall. Father O'Brien also said that the interior furnishings of the church will be furnished. These will include statues, candelabra, etc.

Pledges to the renovation fund may be paid over a period of 156 weeks, covering four tax years, through a system of special envelopes on a weekly, monthly, or quarterly basis. Each wage earner will be asked to give one day's pay each month over the three year period. The 36 month payment plan was adopted to permit everyone in the parish to contribute without causing undue hardship on any one.

Leo E. DeVany of Foley Associates, Inc., a Rochester fund raising counsel, is assisting the volunteer workers on the campaign. Temporary headquarters were set up in St. Patrick school, 309 Front Street. Telephone is 220.
