Brazil Regime Sets Drive Against Reds

Rio De Janeiro — (NC) — The announcement by Minister of Justice Nereu Ramos that the Brazilian government will launch a campaign against communism follows repeated warnings by Brazilian prelates and priests against the growing Red menace in Brazil.

Cardinal de Barros Camara, Archbishop of Rio de Janeiro, in a recent radio speech declared that "anyone who thinks there is no communist danger in Brazil is profoundly deceived." He stated that the Reds look upon Latin America as a "colonial territory" that must be "liberated."

IN DECEMBER, 1955, Father Sebastian Kautz, O.P., Dominican provincial in Brazil, warned that the political situation in Brazil was so bad that it favored "communist infiltration."

The Dominican priest stated that the communists had taken advantage of the uncertain political situation to launch an intensive propaganda campaign to place Reds in various government posts.

Although the Communist party was outlawed in Brazil in 1948, it has since actually strengthened its power through clandestine activities. It is considered by many to be one of the most important political parties in Latin America. Some figures place the number of its members at 40,000.

The surge in communist activity is indicated by the reopening by a Brazilian court of a nine-year-old split against Red leader Luis Carlos Prestes, who has recently returned from Moscow.

THE BRAZILIAN Congress has also debated an amnesty aimed at protecting Communists who have suits pending. A short time ago Imprensa Popular, a communist daily, published a statement by Prestes in which he attacked Catholic prelates as "reactionaries."

When President Juscelino Kubitschek of Brazil was elected, he received strong backing from the communists. At that time Prestes openly proclaimed that the President's victory was due to Red support and that the communists intended to gain advantages from his election.

Although President Kubitschek has been sharply criticized for the support he received from the communists, he has repudiated Red backing. Before his inauguration he visited the United States and was also received by His Holiness Pope Pius XII at the Vatican.

'Death March' Bishop Blesses Cathedral

Chuncheon, Korea — (NC) — Sacred Heart Cathedral here has finally been consecrated. The ceremony was delayed for years by war.

The consecration was performed by Bishop Thomas Quinlan, Vicar Apostolic of Chuncheon and Regent of the Apostolic Delegation to Korea. The Bishop was prepared for a similar ceremony in 1920, when the communists occupied Chuncheon.

IN THOSE hectic days the Bishop was one of the first foreigners to meet the trigger-happy invasion troops. Later he was held prisoner by them for a thousand days and survived the infamous "Death March."

In subsequent battles for Chuncheon, Sacred Heart Cathedral was bombed, strafed and ransacked. It was rebuilt by Father Hubert Bayward of New Zealand while men were still dying in foxholes only a few miles away and Bishop

India Employees Government Workers Hoot Proposal Of Birth Control Instead Of Higher Wages

Madras, India — (NC) — Employees of the Madras state government hooted a suggestion by an official spokesman that they should "limit" the size of their families instead of pleading for higher wages.

When the suggestion was made by R. A. Gopalaswami, Secretary of Education, a large number of the civil servants shouted angry replies, including: "We are not prepared to make sacrifices like that."

His reference to "improvident maternity" aroused a storm of indignation from the delegates, who heckled and booed him. The noisy demonstration forced him to end his address here at a state-wide conference of government employees.

Mr. Gopalaswami proposed that the civil servants adopt family planning and try to provide adequately for their present children. The suggestion was presented in response to demands from the government workers for special allowances to those having more than three children.

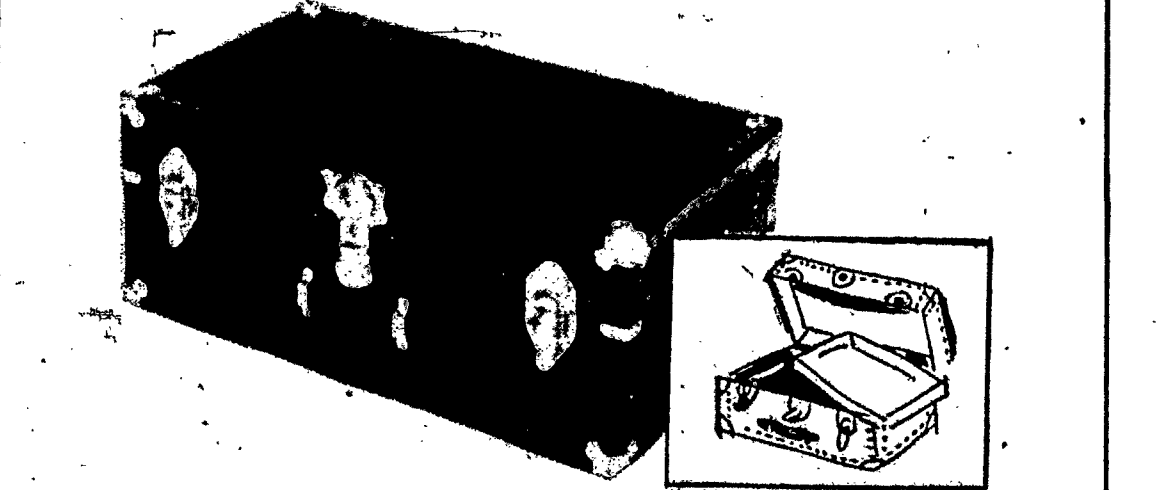

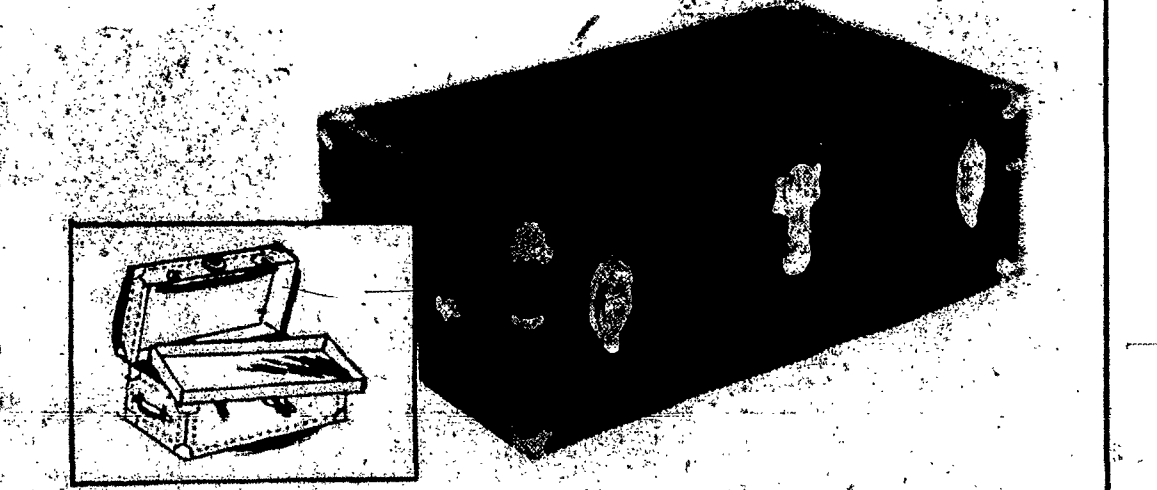

Summer Villa Ready For Pope's Arrival

Castelgandolfo, Italy — (NC) — The papal apartment of Castelgandolfo, where Pope Pius XII will spend the summer months, are being renovated.

It has been rumored that the Holy Father will come here on July 13 instead of the customary date at the end of July. Vatican officials say only that "the Holy Father will probably leave Rome earlier than usual."

DR. EMILIO BONOMEI, director of the papal villa, has stated that it has almost been settled that the Pope will come here during the early part of July, but probably not until after July 5, the date he is scheduled to receive German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer.

The apartments for members of the papal court here will remain closed. In keeping with his custom, the Pope's only companions while at Castelgandolfo will be his chauffeur and valet. During his stay here he will continue to grant private and special audiences. Vatican officials will make the trip here from Rome for carrying out the daily affairs of the administration of the Church.

Easing Of Fasting For Nurses Sought

Leeds, England — (NC) — The Bishops of England and Wales are asking Pope Pius XII to relax fasting regulations for hospital nurses, according to Bishop John C. Heenan of Leeds.

Bishop Heenan, preaching in his cathedral at Mass for the Catholic Nurses Guild, pointed out that fasting rules, despite recent amendments, require nurses wishing to receive Holy Communion to fast from midnight. This is especially difficult for nurses on night duty at hospitals, he noted.

Prelate Falls Asleep During Own Sermon

Liverpool — (NC) — How a prelate fell asleep during his own sermon was told at a stadium rally here by Archbishop Gerald P. O'Hara, Bishop of Savannah-Atlanta and Apostolic Delegate to Great Britain.

The prelate, also an Archbishop, reads each sermon into a tape recorder and plays the sermon back to memorize it. Archbishop O'Hara related, halfway through one play back he fell sound asleep.

"So," said Archbishop O'Hara, "if any of his listeners falls into snoring now, he can't complain."

Then he let it be known that the prelate was Archbishop William Godfrey of Liverpool, who was presiding at the rally.

Pope Pius Gives Letter To Kennedy For President

Vatican City — (NC) — Joseph P. Kennedy, former U.S. Ambassador to Great Britain, said after a 50-minute audience with Pope Pius XII that the Pope had given him a written message telling of his prayers for President Eisenhower.

The prominent Boston layman said the Pope showed extraordinary interest in the President's condition and expressed relief at the news of his progress since he was operated on at Walter Reed Hospital in Washington.

Mr. Kennedy reported that the Holy Father had recalled his personal acquaintance with Mr. Eisenhower with great pleasure. The Pontiff noted that as soon as he heard that the President was ill he sent a message expressing his concern and promising prayers for Mr. Eisenhower's recovery. Mr. Kennedy added:

The former ambassador said after his audience that the Pope himself appeared to be in excellent health.
