

Objectionable Literature Banned By Barbershops

Banning of objectionable literature in all barbershops of the Rochester Master Barbers Association on the association's decision was hailed as another victory over publishers and purveyors of such literature at the June 12 meeting of Monroe County Chapter, Catholic War Veterans.

Marlo Ferrari, first vice commander, who is spearheading the Catholic War Veterans drive against indecent literature in Monroe County made the motion to send a letter of commendation to the Master Barbers Association "for this forthright action."

Among the 160 graduates of St. Michael's College who received their B.A. degrees were 10 men and women from the Rochester area. They completed their high school courses at Aquinas, Nazareth and Mercy High Schools.

LEADING: THE graduates in History was Mr. Alfred Graham, C.S.B., who received the Alumni Gold Medal in Modern History, the John Fraser Gray Scholarship and the Maurice Cody Memorial Prize.

Mr. Samuel D. Femiato, C.S.B., received the College Gold Medal in Modern Languages and the Order of the Sons of Italy of Ontario Prize in Honor Italian.

Mr. Richard J. Schiefen, C.S.B., received the Trustees' Gold Medal in Modern History and Modern Language and the Prize of the Minister of Switzerland to Canada in Italian.

Philip G. Clarke, Brighton, received the College Gold Medal for Proficiency in the General Course.

AT A RECEPTION in honor of the graduates and their parents given by the Alumni Association of St. Michael's College, Philip Wood, the President of the Students' Council, received a Gold Key for his outstanding work during his college career.

It was also announced that Philip Sweeney received a Fellowship to the University of Chicago to do graduate work in History and International Relations.

Father Butler Completes Studies For Doctorate

The Rev. Ignatius (William) Butler, T.O.R., has completed his course of studies leading to a Doctorate in the field of Sacred Theology at Catholic University of America, Washington, D. C.

Father Butler is the son of Mr. and Mrs. William F. Butler, 697 Post Ave., Rochester.

Topic for the priest's doctoral dissertation is "The Moral Problem of the Theatre." He worked under the direction of the Very Rev. Francis J. Connell, C.S.S.R., dean of the School of Sacred Theology at C.U.

Father Ignatius defended his dissertation during early June and passed the required examinations leading to the degree. At present, he is preparing his dissertation for publication.

A GRADUATE of Our Lady of Good Counsel School, Father Ignatius attended Aquinas Institute from where he entered the Third Order Regular of St. Francis of Penance in March, 1945.

He received the name Brother Ignatius and was graduated from St. Francis Preparatory School in June of the same year. He entered the Order's novitiate the following month and professed simple vows in July, 1946.

Father Ignatius entered St. Francis College from which he received his B.A. degree in the Spring of 1948, he was sent to India where he studied at St. Albert's Seminary, Ranchi, taught by the Belgian Jesuits.

Theological studies were pursued at the Angelicum, Rome, St. Francis Seminary, Loretto, Pa. and the Catholic University before Father Ignatius was ordained in Sacred Heart Cathedral, Rochester, on June 6, 1954.

Following ordination he completed his theological studies at C.U. and received the Licentiate in Sacred Theology in June, 1954. For the past two years, Father Butler has pursued studies leading to a doctorate in Sacred Theology at the Washington university.

Notre Dame Grad Named Manager At Sibley Store

After his discharge from the service in 1945, Liston became store superintendent and director of personnel at Mandel Bros. in 1946 and held that position until 1950. He then became general superintendent of Bloomington's in New York City from 1950 to 1952. He was then recalled to Mandel Bros. Inc. in Chicago, as store manager, vice president and director, a position he held from 1952 until the present.

Liston was a member of the board of directors of the National Dry Goods Assn. and chairman of the store management group of the association from 1955 to 1956.
