Every five minutes Mr. Brown asked for his wife. "She is upstairs," one of the children always volunteered. After being asked for the fourth time, one of the little daughters finally commented, "Seems, Dad, you can't get along five minutes without Mom!" "That's why I married her, honey!" he promptly responded.
Love is really not like Cupid. It does grow up. It becomes mature and strong. Real love gets stronger day by day. It is a wonderful endless adventure.

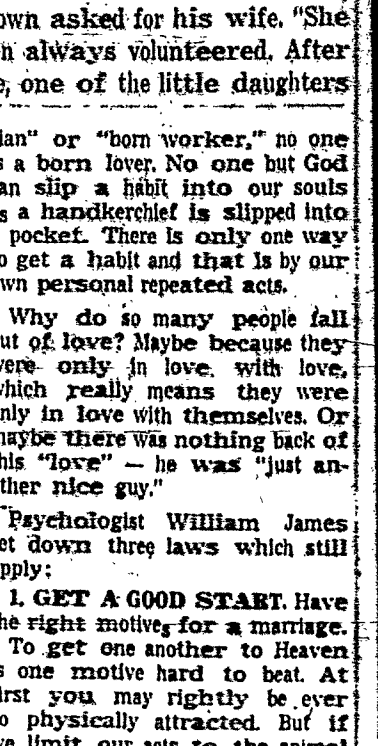
The jokesters are saying that the honeymoon is over when he comes late for supper and she has a note all ready telling him she can find it in the icebox. But real love is a permanent pattern, not a mere episode.
Psychologists agree that love is a habit and must be cultivated like any other desirable habit. Just as no one is a "born must."



Start with a bang! Start your career of marital love roller-coaster style. Make a public announcement of your engagement six to nine months before the wedding. Have a formal and splendid and magnificent wedding as the Church will permit—never consent to a clandestine, sham or forced snuggled affair. Never even dream of the possibility of a divorce. Divorce should be as repugnant and impossible as the idea of a priest changing his mind after ordination. Put into this love everything you possess.
2. REPEAT the desired actions until they become automatic. A habit increases as it cuts its groove deeper and deeper. A groove becomes a trail, a trail a road, eventually it becomes a four-lane highway.
Our habits are the channels of our activity. One habit destroys the other. Love will destroy selfishness.
3. PERMIT NO EXCEPTIONS to occur until the process of love is complete (which is probably not until death). You may never fully succeed in this rule, but do strive to perfect it. A lover never cold-bloodedly offends the beloved. His love can never be questioned or taken for granted.
William James attached particular importance to this rule and it is perhaps the most important of the three mentioned: "Each lapse is like letting fall a ball of string which one is carefully winding up; a single slip undoes more than a great many turns will wind again."
Before the honeymoon is over, husband and wife sometimes begin to have moods, to sulk or to snarl, or to nag, to bawl each other out, to suspect one another. One such exception to the habit of love can change one's whole pattern of life. One little fault can destroy us.

Millwaukee — (NC) — Chancellor Konrad Adenauer of the Federal Republic of Germany said Very Rev. Edward J. Chancellor Adenauer also received an honorary doctor of laws degree from Marquette, during which he praised Jesuit education.

Encouraged by the Supreme Court decision in the security risk cases, the Communists now propose that all American internal security be scuttled. This proposal is made in the Daily Worker for June 13, which acclaims the Supreme Court ruling in "non-sensitive" Government posts as "a blow to witch-hunting."
If the Reds have their way, as they have had so much in the past, the United States will be completely denuded of a any measure for its protection against infiltration and espionage.
The situation is bad enough for the United States as it now stands with the Communist triumph in too large a measure, with the Communists' contentions over the past several years now being too much affirmed.
It will be recalled that the Supreme Court by a vote of 6-3 declared in early June that the 1950 law covering internal security could not apply to "non-sensitive" positions in the Government. Supreme Court Justice Thomas Clark, in a vigorous dissenting opinion, declared that this decision would open the way for a horde of subversives in the Government. The rejoicing of the Daily Worker at what had taken place seems to confirm Justice Clark's strong words.
The present decision ignores the nature of the Communist conspiracy, and that, above all, Communists and their strident

against whom we are endeavoring to protect ourselves. And it advises us to follow the example of Britain, expecting that this advice will go out into far-reaching circles beyond the Communist party.
So far as official policies are concerned in relation to Soviet Russia, Britain is an example which we should avoid. It is that nation which has taken the lead in recognizing Red China, thus opening the door to the most disastrous war in the history of the world. It is Britain which is right now seeking material aid for Soviet Russia, while the United States is burdened with heavy taxes to build up an armament wall for its defense.
It is Great Britain which has just recently broken down the structure of the United Nations as a possible force against aggression by permitting Hayato to sell rubber to Red China. In order to build up the Soviet war machine. Immediately the Indonesian Government follows the British lead and announces that it will end any embargo against the sale of rubber to Mao Tse-tung. All of this is done in mockery of the United Nations' resolution declaring Red China to be an aggressor nation.
Even as it commends Britain and the Supreme Court, the Daily Worker wants to go farther than the mere removal of "non-sensitive" posts from security regulations. It declares categorically: "The only real safety and security for America lies in ending the witch-hunting in any kind of post." It wants to open the door to the activities of more men like Alger Hiss and Harry Dexter White.

Jesuit Denies Reds Inspire
Negro Bid For Justice

Syracuse, N. Y. — (RNS) — The Rev. John LaFarge, S.J., of New York, a leader of the Catholic interracial movement, assailed charges that Negro demands for racial justice are Communist-inspired.

He told a Communion breakfast sponsored by the Catholic Interracial Council of Syracuse that while supremacy advocates have professed to see a Red tinge in the work of the National Urban League and the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.
This is "a completely false charge" and the "precise contrary" is true, he said.
FATHER LAFARGE, an associate editor of America, national Jesuit weekly, is the chairman and one of the founders of the Catholic Interracial Council of New York. That group was established in 1934, and there are now 26 similar councils in cities throughout the country, seven of them in the South.
The priest declared that "Negro leaders are among the outstanding leaders in destroying Communistic, un-American influence."

Reading from the Sunday Daily Worker, a Communist publication, to support his refutation of charges that Negroes are Communist, he cited an article by a Negro Communist which denounced NAACP leaders as "agents of Wall Street" and expressed regret that leaders of Negro organizations had escaped Communist influence.
"THE COMMUNISTS" were kicked off the bandwagon of Negro progress," Father LaFarge said, "and it is going ahead gloriously. But they won't get back on."
Urging priests and laymen to cooperate in strengthening those who work against "the non-Christian caste system," the Jesuit editor declared that the race problem should be viewed as "an opportunity to do a great work for God and country."
