As a young man he worked in the City Playground department and was an investigator for the Department of Public Welfare and later its senior research assistant.

During the war, Mr. Riley served in the Coast Guard in the Third Naval District Intelligence Office. He was appointed veterans' service counselor for the county after his discharge from the Coast Guard.

Besides Sister Kathleen, Mr. Riley, who was a bachelor is survived by his brother, Dr. Walter J. Riley, Monroe County coroner's physician; another sister Mrs. Howard Fink of Rochester, two nieces and a nephew.

AT NAZARETH College, Sister was Vice President of the Catholic Students' Mission Crusade and President of the Fraternity Mission Unit.

She is the sister of Mrs. James F. Gardner, 1672 Chili Ave., Rochester and of Mrs. Bernard Lavey of Ridgewood, New Jersey.

Since 1952, she has been doing social work in the Catholic Charities Department of the Archdiocese of San Francisco.

Hawaii is one of the oldest of the Maryknoll Sisters' missions. In 28 years work there, the Sisters have staffed six large parochial schools on the islands of Oahu and Maui. They also are responsible for the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine Work in the islands, thus teaching religion to thousands of public school children.
