St. Joseph Nuns Publish Cookbook

Englewood, N. J. — (NC) — An unusual cookbook has been prepared by the Sisters of St. Joseph at St. Michael's novitiate here.

Combining recipes used by Sisters of St. Joseph in many parts of the world, "St. Joseph's Cookbook" has been published in conjunction with the novitiate's first annual bazaar.

It contains recipes for Yugoslav, Italian, Scottish, Polish, Russian, Irish, Filipino and Scandinavian dishes, as well as "Fallen Angel's Food."

The 26th Annual Novena of the Discalced Carmelite Sisters in honor of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel will be held in their new Monastery, on West Jefferson Road, Henrietta beginning July 8 and continuing each day until the Feast of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel on Monday, July 16.

Devotions will be held in the new chapel after the 6:45 a.m. Mass each day. Mass on Sunday will be at 8 a.m. On Sunday afternoon at 4 p.m. Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament will be imparted.

Persons attending the novena may get a partial indulgence of seven years and seven quarantines each time they are present. A Plenary Indulgence may be obtained for attending five services and the usual conditions of Confession and Holy Communion within eight days of the Feast.

Those unable to attend may mail their petitions to the Monastery, West Jefferson Road, Henrietta, N.Y. They will be placed at the feet of the statue of Our Lady within the cloister.

The Novena will close with High Mass and sermon on Sunday, July 16 at 9 a.m.

Assumption College Gets Federal Loan

Worcester, Mass. — (NC) — Assumption College here has received preliminary approval of a \$580,000 federal loan for two buildings now under construction.

Father Armand H. Desautels, A.A. president, has announced that the college was demolished by a 1933 tornado which swept the area, taking more than 90 lives. The loan will cover cost of a dormitory with room for 120 students and a dining hall seating 200. The preliminary approval came from the Federal Housing and Home Finance Agency.

Father Damien's Body Examined

Louvain, Belgium — (NC) — The identification of the remains of Father, Damien de Veuster, "The Apostle of the Lepers," took place here in the chapel of the Sacred Hearts Fathers.

It was done by a canonical tribunal headed by Cardinal van Roey, Archbishop of Malines.

This is one of the steps in Father Damien's beatification process formally introduced in Rome in February, 1935.

Father Damien worked among the lepers of Molokai, Hawaii, for 16 years before contracting the disease himself. He died on Molokai on August 15, 1889. His remains were transferred to Louvain in 1936.

Retreat Conference To Hear Romulo

Hartford, Conn. — (RNS) — Brig. Gen. Carlos P. Romulo, Philippine Ambassador to the United States, will be the principal speaker at the national convention of the Catholic Laymen's Retreat Conference here, August 24-26. He will address the convention banquet.

Another feature of the meeting will be a solemn pontifical evening Mass in St. Joseph Cathedral celebrated by Archbishop Henry J. O'Brien of Hartford. Auxiliary Bishop James H. Griffiths of New York will preach the sermon.

Also planned are a series of workshops on spiritual retreats for the armed forces, and in relationship to problems of mental health and alcoholism.

26th Anniversary Of First Mass Set At Holy Angels

Twenty-sixth anniversary of the First Mass celebrated at Holy Angels Convent, 1326 Winton Road North will be observed by the Sisters of Our Lady of Charity on Monday, July 9.

The Sisters arrived on June 16, 1930 and stayed at the Sisters of St. Joseph Motherhouse until the former farmhouse on Winton Road was ready for occupancy.

The frame building was to have been a temporary residence but the nuns are still housed there and they point out the need after 26 years for a new Monastery.

TWO OF the original six Sisters are with the community, two others have died and two are at the Buffalo Monastery of the order. The Sisters conduct the Holy Angels Home for Girls.
