Tito 'Independence' Said New Red Hoax

At this historical moment, we can remind ourselves of that "diabolical propaganda" of Communism to which Pius XI referred 19 years ago, and which, the Pope said, often affects many who do not agree with the Red materialistic philosophy or dictatorial system.

The current Communist line, as it unfolds in the world Red organs, justifies that characterization. It makes much of the agreement for "co-operation" between the Russian and Yugoslav Communist parties for the advance of world Socialism, signed recently in Moscow.

At the same time, it seeks to take advantage of Tito's "independence" to argue that the alleged show of "independence" on the part of the Communist parties of France, Italy, and the United States is genuine. It represents them as no longer dependent upon Moscow for their attitudes and their line.

The New Times, in the issue of May 31, devotes a major part of its pages to the new relationship of "co-operation" between the Communist parties of Soviet Russia and Yugoslavia, straining the words of the agreement that they are both proceeding "in the spirit of the internationalist principles of Marxism-Leninism."

IN OTHER words, its aim is to advance the old "people's front" tactic and "coalition Government" device which succeeded in the past in bringing so many millions of people under the domination of the Soviets.

When we read in the Tito-Moscow agreement how the Communist parties of Soviet Russia and Yugoslavia are to cooperate, we see that this seeming revelation is in fact the old Communist tactic of "united front" and "people's front" tactics.

To put it frankly, this is to be the last of the "independent fronts" for the Department of the West, pending the final end of the world war.

The alleged demonstration of "independence" by the Communist parties in non-Soviet countries is of a like pattern. In turn, Vladimir Togliatti, general secretary of the Communist party of Italy, the political bureau of the French Communist party, and the national committee of the Communist party of the United States have asked Nikita Khrushchev to explain why the present Soviet leaders did not do something about Stalin more quickly than they did.

That this is a general line of the Communists to deceive "liberal" and "progressive" elements into believing that the respective Red parties are now free of Moscow domination, is shown by the fact that Communist party after party in other countries has taken this stand.

It is also registered in the republication in Pravda of Moscow of the article by Eugene Dennis, general secretary of the Communist party of the United States—first published in the Daily Worker of June 18—asking the same question.

But it has not been sharply pointed out in the general press that each one of these alleged "independent" statements follows the line of Khrushchev fundamentally. They all accept without question and overnight, merely on Khrushchev's word, the charges that Stalin committed the crimes ascribed to him—after having praised Stalin for years as "the architect of the new society and the new man." They all stand on "Lenin's liberating teachings," just as Khrushchev did.

What is more to the point, not one of them calls for the liberation of the enslaved peoples and for an end to the degrading, Socialist conditions which have brought about the desperate protest of the Poznan steel workers.

To trust Tito and to aid him, after his agreement of "co-operation" with the Kremlin, will be injurious to the United States. The Communists themselves make that evident. To imagine that Communist parties have become suddenly "independent" of Moscow will be equally fatal.

7 Polish Priests Reported Jailed In Poznan Reprisal

Berlin—(NC)—Seven of the 20 priests who were reported arrested in the Poznan rebellion have been confined by the Red regime to undisclosed prisons in Poland, it was learned here.

The priests, it was reported, were arrested by Red police after they had attended the consecration of the Poznan cathedral. The information here stated that all of the priests were held overnight in a police station, that seven were later deported to prisons outside Poznan, and that the other 13 were released.

THE PRIESTS were reportedly charged with taking part in the Poznan workers' revolt for more food. It was learned here that after the revolt free food was being distributed in parish kitchens in Poznan to assist the Polish people. Auxiliary Bishop Francis Jedwabski of Poznan, is said to have offered special prayers for those who were wounded in the three-day uprising.

The International Red Cross in Geneva has received a telegram from the Polish Red Cross rejecting the U.S. Government's offer to send food to Poznan. The telegram stated: "We see no necessity for accepting the proposal of the U.S. Government."

THE POLISH RED regime, it was reported here, tabbed the U.S. offer a propaganda move linked with unfriendly motives. The Reds had stated that they would not accept any charity from the U.S., but were ready to buy grain through commercial transactions.

It was learned here that the people of Poznan are terrified by the large scale purge trials being conducted by the Polish Reds to punish workers alleged to have taken part in the "bread and freedom" revolt. Some sources estimate that more than 1,000 Poles have been jailed by the Reds.

Canada Hits Red Bids To Refugees

Ottawa, Ont.—(NC)—The Canadian Government has asked that its attention be called to any attempt by foreign governments to interfere with citizens of Canada.

Canada will not tolerate any such interference, the House of Commons External Affairs Committee was told in a statement read by Jules Leger, undersecretary of state.

The statement pointed out that communist governments are attempting to lure refugees in Canada back to their homelands behind the Iron Curtain. Only a handful of refugees have accepted the lure. Some have since turned up in Canadian offices abroad deploring conditions which they found in their homelands. They were seeking means of coming back to Canada, the statement said.

Poland's Art Treasures To Stay In Quebec

Quebec—(NC)—Premier Maurice Duplessis of Quebec has declared that "no deal, agreement or compromise" with the communist government of Poland ever will be made by Quebec for the return of the Polish art treasures now held under custody of Quebec.

The Polish communist government recently made new overtures to the Government of Canada for the return of the treasures, estimated to be worth millions of dollars. QUEBEC HAS impounded the treasures in the Quebec Museum in private vaults until such time as the government of Quebec is satisfied that a truly representative patriotic Polish government is in power.

Co-Existence Scored In Red Paper

Berlin—(NC)—The East German Communist Party's official organ has declared that peaceful co-existence between communism and Christianity is meaningless and impossible.

The East Berlin Red daily, Neues Deutschland, in its lead article reversed the earlier stand of the communists that peaceful co-existence is possible and desirable.

THE IDEA OF co-existence has been denounced repeatedly by Christian speakers everywhere. Now the communists themselves denounce the idea.

The article in Neues Deutschland declared that Marxism and Leninism are opposed to a religion which does not grant the state first place in the minds of the people. Christianity, with its emphasis on religious principles, is incompatible with the Marxist-Leninist ideal of total service to the state, the editorial asserted.

Between the state and the Church there can be nothing but a kind of tolerance for a while, according to the communist paper, but the struggle of state and Church for supremacy is inevitable.

Catholic Wins Labor Post From Red

London—(NC)—Communist attempts to control the British trade union movement were greatly checked by the election of a Catholic Action leader as president of the Amalgamated Engineering Union, second largest union in the country.

William J. Carron received 83,847 against 35,400 cast for the communist candidate, Reg Birch, who had been expected to win. Mr. Birch's victory would have given the Reds a tighter say in the union's affairs since they already have two supporters on the top executive committee.

There are 22,000,000 Catholics in Africa; 18,875,000 of them are already baptized and 2,970,000 are catechumens. Of this total about 20,000,000 are in Black Africa.

THE PHENOMENAL growth is due in great part to the great efforts of the missionaries during the past 30 years. According to the figures in the Fides bulletin there were only 3,131 foreign and 94 native priests in 1912.

By 1927 their numbers had changed respectively to 3,567 and 246 and according to latest statistics increased to 10,796 foreign and 1,963 native priests.

On the African continent today there are 46 major seminaries with 1,887 seminarians. Forty of these with 1,734 students are in Black Africa.

Progress Of Church In 'Dark Continent' Outlined In Report

Vatican City—(NC)—Africa with its 22,000,000 Catholics is returning to the days when Alexandria and Carthage contended with Rome in faith and fervor, according to Fides, international mission news agency.

According to the Fides report, the number of Catholics has quadrupled since 1927. The greatest growth has been in the last ten years, making the African continent flourish as one of the most Catholic sections of the world.

A SUMMARY of the Fides report follows: The African continent, totaling about 213,000,000 inhabitants, is divided into two parts, White Africa and Black Africa. White Africa comprises Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia, Sahara, the Gold Coast, Lybia, and Egypt.

The rest of the continent south of the Sahara is Black Africa, predominantly Negro. The two parts are clearly distinct in every respect, including religion. The first part is predominantly Moslem while Black Africa is half pagan but is converting to Christianity and Islamism.

There are 22,000,000 Catholics in Africa; 18,875,000 of them are already baptized and 2,970,000 are catechumens. Of this total about 20,000,000 are in Black Africa.

THE PHENOMENAL growth is due in great part to the great efforts of the missionaries during the past 30 years. According to the figures in the Fides bulletin there were only 3,131 foreign and 94 native priests in 1912.

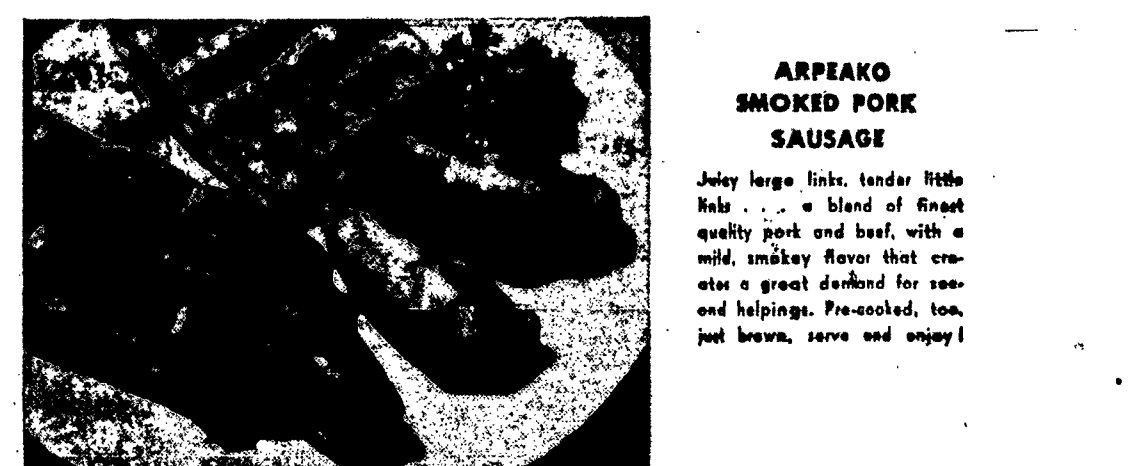
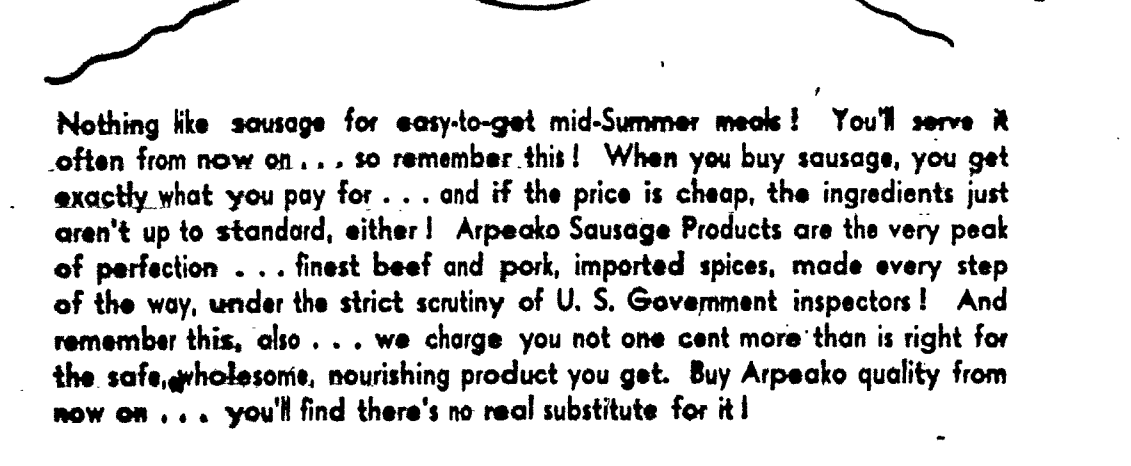
